# ELEVEN LIVES LOST.

Explosion of a Tugboat Boiler on the Mississippi River.

SUNK IN LESS THAN FIVE MINUTES.

But for the Fact That Another Tug Was Near by the Loss of Life Would Have Been Much Greater - The Engineer Among the Dead.

VICESBURG, Miss., May 19 .- One of the most terrible river disasters of recent years occurred Sunday night about twenty-five miles below this city. The towboat Harry Brown, of Pittaburg, npward bound from New Orleans, oxploded her boilors at 11 o'clock. The boat was a complete wreck, and sank in less than five minutes.

and sank in less than five minutes. Eleven lives are known to be lost, as follows: Pilot Norman Dravo, G. W. Bardaley, steersman; William Dougherty, chiof engineer; Miss Annie Hess, chamber-maid, Tom Jadge, freman; William Wil-son, fireman; William Fitzsinmons, first mate; Pat Carniff, second mate; William Kelly, lamp trimmer; Frank Adrian, of Cincinnati; John Wagner, of Louisville. They are as follows: Captain John Kime, hip seriously injured; William Grimme, carpenter, leg broken; John Hardy, fireman, badly soalded and otherwise seriously injured; Dennis J. The mission on the Island was attacked, and the missionaries escaped with difficulty, going back to Sydney by the first ship. The murders on the islands of Manning Straits were followed by acts of cannibalism.




