Methodist Conference Adopts the Committee's Recommendations.

ELECTION OF BISHOPS NOW ON.

It Is Now Conceded That Chaptain McCabe, of New York, Is in the Lead, Though the Election Will Doubtiess Prove Interestlog and Lively.

CLEVELAND, May 15.—Yesterday's session of the Methodist Episcopal conference was the most important that has been held yet. The long expected report of the committee on episcopacy was presented and adopted after an animated debate, and adopted after an animated debate, which was interspersed with incidents of dramatic and pathetic interest. The report provided for the retirement of the venerable Bishops Bowman and Foster on the ground of non-effectiveness, declared that the time is opportune for the election of a bishop of African descent, and also provided for the election of but two bishops to take the place of those who was to take the place of these who provided for the election of but two bishops to take the place of those who were retired. The three propositions in the report were agreed to by a large majority.
This action relates only to the bishops in
this country, and takes no account of the
bishops in the missionary field, who will
be considered later. The two bishops who
were retired will be supported by the book
concern.

This morning the conference proceeded to the election of the two bishops. The contest has narrowed down, and it is now conceded that Chaplain McCabe, of New York, is in the lead, although it is doubtful if he yet has the two-thirds vote required to elect. Chancellor J. R. Day is said to have decided to withdraw and said to have decided to withdraw and throw his support to Rev. Dr. J. W. Hamilton, of Boston. Jesse F. Case, of Pitsburg, a layman, who is ambitious to secure election to a secretaryship of the Freedman's Ald society, may alienate certain Pittsburg support from Dr. Charles W. Smith, of that city, by joining with the Day-Hamilton forces. The election is likely to prove very interesting and lively.

The church extension committee de-cided to recommend that hereafter no as-sistance be given to churches that cost more than \$10,000, except by special legis-lation. It was asserted that many wealthy churches had in the past secured ald which ought to be reserved for poor con-

gregations:
The committee on book concern decided to recommend the appointment of a commission to prepare a new hymnal for the use of the church, from which much of the light music now in use would be

eliminated. The committee on education took up the subject of making loans to students. It was decided to refuse such loans to students in the Mexican and South American conference. It will be suggested to the conference, in view of the fact that \$600,000 has been loaned in twenty-two years, and only \$50,000 of that sum repaid. that a better system of accounting be adopted, and all students who are assisted be required to waive the statute of limita-

tion in the notes they give as security.

There was a lively meeting of the committee on temperance, and as a result two reports defining the policy of the church with respect to the temperance question will be submitted to the conference. The majority report will be in line with the action of the conference of four years ago at Omaha, which was to the effect that no political party has the right to expect the support of Christians if that party does not declare in favor of the total prohibition of the liquor traffic. This report will have the support of sixteen members of the committee, and will be advocated by Dr. Lowther, of Wichita,

Fifteen members of the committee will aign a minority report opposing the ma-jority. It will urge that the adoption of the majority report will commit the church to the Prohibition party, and claim that more effective, practical temperance work can be accomplished through the medium of the old parties. Dr. Everett, of the New England conference, Dr. McFarland of Illinois, Professor 'larris of Maine and Dr. Quayle of Kansas City will support the minority report. The committee decided unanimously to co-operate with the antisaloon league.

Fatal Wind Storm Near Chicago. CHICAGO, May 12.—During a short but violent wind storm yesterday afternoon a derrick on the drainage canal at Sag Bridge, a few miles from this city, was blown down and ten men were injured, three of whom may die. The injured men are: H. J. Kuetsch, legs cut, chest crushed and internal injuries; E. M. Lantz, skull fractured; Patrick Roach, four ribs broken and internal injuries. Timothy Crowe, Ed mund Fitzmaurice, Charles Jordan, John Murphy, William Norton, Frank Rogga and Frank Rezch were also hurt, and while the injuries of most of them are severe, it is not expected that any but the three first named will die.

Cashler Love Gets Five Years. ROCHESTER, N. Y., May 15.—John Love, the defaulting cashier of the First Na-tional bank of Watkins, N. Y., who pleaded guilty in the United States district court on Tuesday to an indictment charg-ing him with making a false report to the comptroller of the currency regarding the financial condition of the bank, was sentenced yesterday afternoon by Judge Coxe to serve five years in Auburn state prison.

No Compremise with Strikers.

Milwauker, May 15.—Efforts of the Morchants' association to raise a purse of \$5,000 to induce men employed to fill strikers' places to leave the city has failed. The street railway companies refused to consent to the proposition. The company now has a full quota of men. President Gom-pers, of the American Federation of Labor, arrived today, and there may be an ex-tended sympathy strike.


