



Senators Want to Rush Through the Appropriation Bills.

THE RIVER AND HARBOR BILL

If Is Expected That the Conference Report Will be Made Early in the Week, but the Fate of the Proposed Leonclads is a Matter of Conjecture,

WARRISGTON, May 18.—The present week in the senate bids fair to be given up largely to matters pertaining to the District of Columbia. The consideration of the "dollar gas" bill will consume considerably more time, and when it is disposed of the district appropriation bill will be taken up if it is not cut out by the conference report on the legislative bill. The district appropriation bill will probably lead to considerable discussion. It is expected that there will be an effort to have the legislative, executive and Indicial appropriation bill recommitted for further consideration of the provision in regard to United States commissioners, as the to United States commissioners, as the house provision, which the senate confer-rees have accepted, is distasteful to many

of the senators.
It is also expected that the conference is port on the river and harbor bill will be made early in the week, but whether this will consume much time will depend upon how much of the senate additions the senate conferrees may concede to those of

the house.

The senate managers are still disposed to press the appropriation bills to the exclusion of other business, and will have the fortifications bill ready to take up as soon as the district bill and the conference reports on other appropriation bills are disposed of. They do not contemplate giving way to other bills, except those to which no opposition is made, until the last of the appropriation bills shall be passed. They no opposition is made, until the last of the appropriation tills shall be passed. There are still these appropriation tills which have not received the attention of the senate. These are the District of Columbia, fortifications and general deficiency.

The house probably will devote much of its time during the week to the considera-

tion of conference reports on appropriation bills. It is expected that the conference reports on both the naval and river and harbor bills will be presented, and on both lively fights are anticipated. The scenare lively lights are anticipated. The scanre amendments to the latter bill, placing half a dozen additional projects under the contract system at a cost of about \$12,000,000, will attract the bulk of the opposition, and in case the senate does not yield to the house on the naval bill in respect to the number of new battleships to be authorized another research. another attempt will be made by the economists of the bouse to agree to the senate's reduction. FOUR HUNDRED MILES OF GUARDS

From St. Petershurg to Moscow is a Double Line of Soldiegs, and None but the Impegial Teals be Allowed on the Road During

Fr. Perrusancio, May 18.—The ezar and rearina, with their infant daughter, the Grand Duchess Olga Nicolatevan, accompanied by a numerous suite and by the whole of the imperial household, took their departure last evening for Moscow Th. The august eromony of the coronation of the car and czarina, and the fetes which proceds and follow that event will fill up the time constantly from now until June 7 which is the date fixed upon for the return of the imperial party to St. Peters

The train which carries the imperial pair to the ancient palace of holy Russia was especially built throughout for this jour ney, and is said to be the finest that ever rode on rails. The appointments and fin-ish of it are on a scale of magnificence in harmony with everything else connected with the coronation, for which the most

lavish expenditures have not been spared, even for the minutest details.

No speed record is attempted with the imperial train, the safety and comfort of the august immates being the sole considerations. All traffic ceased over the line before the departure of the train from ere, and no other wheels than those of this train will run at the same time on the tracks between here and Moscow.

The line between Sr. Petersburg and Moscow runs almost in a straight line for the 400 miles. It is related that when the angineers designated to build the line appealed to the ear for his orders regarding the route he placed a ruler upon the may and drew a straight line between the twenty. cities, thus solving the engineering diffi-culties with an autocratic hand.

The 100 miles of the line are guarded by

a double guard of soldlers. Every detail of the journey and of the consuments in Moscow have been arranged for months, an army of officials having been engaged upon the work in this city, amid much silv and excitement, and also intense auxiory.
