



Minister Breckinridge, the special envoys and their staffs last night attended a re-ception given by the Russian foreign minister, Prince Lobonoff-Rostovsky, Next week Mr. Breekinridge will give a dinner to distinguished American visitors to the mation, and later, probably on June 8 will give a reception, inviting the Russian princes and foreign princes attendant upon the coronation and the foreign ambassadors and about a thousand others.

BERLIN, May 23.—According to news-from Moscow, after the coronation the emr's great uncle Grand Duke Michael Nicolalavitch, will resign the presidency of the state council and retire from public life. He will be succeeded in that office by the Grand Duke Vladimir Alexandrovitch, the crar's eldest uncle, whose post of com-mander of the guards goes to the Grand Duke Sergius, whose wife, formerly Pein-cess Elizabeth of Hosse, is the candida's sister, who will thus be located at St. sister, who will thus be founded at St. Petersburg. It has been the ezarina's de-sire to have bur favorite sister mar her. Count Worsnzoff Daskhoff will succeed Grand Duke Sergius as governor general

Bussian Opposition to France.

LONDON, May 23. The Dally News publishes a dispatch from Moscow, which says: "Popular comments on the French mission are in no way flattering, and the French alliance is strongly deprecated by the lower classes, and even by the enlighened official classes, who have easily dis-covered that there is no dopth of sincerin-in the professed fellowship. The French alliance is simply regarded as an extgency of the European situation, to be dropped when it has served its purpose. The time is probably not far distant when Russia will be in a position to discard all western European alliances."

SUING SECRETARY KELSEY.

Affleged Violation of Contract Involving a Hig Fortune.

TRENTON, May 23.—Charles A. Furbush of Philadelphia, yesterday brought suit in the United States circuit court against Secretary of State Henry C. Kelsey, of the Secondary of Scale Hunty C. Newark Gas Light company, of Newark, and the Newark Gas company. Mr. Furbush states that in 1803 John P. Persch, of Philadelphia, entered into a contract with Kelsey under which the latter was to sell him the entire capital stock of the two first named corporations for the purpose of consolidating them and forming the Newark Gas company. Persch was to pay Newark Gas company. Persen was to pay Kelsey 87,000,000, reserving as his profits out of the deal 81,000,000 of gold bonds and 81,000,000 of the preferred stock and \$000, 000 of the common stock of the proposed new company. Kelsey, it is avorred, was to secure for the new company all the gas business in Newark for ten years or more, supplying the cas for not less than \$1.40 and cubic feet to private co ers and for not less than \$1.25 to public

This contract, it is said, was made with This contract, it is said, was made with the full knowledge and consent of the stockholiers of the companies to be absorbed, but notwithstanding this they failed to deliver the stock, allowing the consideration to be effected in violation of the agreement. Kelsey, says the complaint, offered Persch \$50,000 worth of the common stock of the new company in settlement of his claim, but the offer was rejected. Since the consolidation Persch has transferred his alleged rights to Furbush, transferred his alleged rights to Furtush, and now seeks a judicial settlement of the controversy. Mr. Kelsey is president of the consultriated company.


