May Compromise Milwaukee's Strike. MILWAUKEE, May 28.—There is a possi-bility that the street railway strike will be settled. President Cromwell, of New York, who is here, approached the strikers on Tue-slay, and negotiations for a settle-mentary in progress. An important meet-ing of strike managers was held at the striker's headquarters yesterday, and when it was over telegrams were sent to President Gompers, of the American Federation of Labor, urging that he come to Milwaukse without delay.

HALIFAX, N. S., May 28 .- A terrible disaster is reported from St. Paul's Island, in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. About ind-night the Norwegian bark Boodrene, from Acommonth for Miramichi, was wrecked half a mile from the fog whistle on St. Paul's Island. A thick mist and a heavy see prevalled at the time. Captain H. Wison, First Mate H. M. Sweenson, Second Mate Thoudore Parson and Scamen Harold Nelson and Emil Soterstron were lost. Five men were saved.
