

THE PRESIDENT'S VETO.

Reasons for Opposing the River and Harbor Bill.

THE MEASURE TOO EXTRAVAGANT.

"I am Convinced," He Says, "That the Bill Opens the Way to Insidious and Increasing Abuses, and Is Especially Unsuited to These Times of Depressed Business."

Washington, May 30.-President Clevewashington, May 30.—President Clove-and yesterday afternoon vetoed the river and harbor appropriation bill, accompany ing the returned bill with a message to the house, in which he says in part:

"There are 417 items of appropriation contained in this bill, and every part of the country is represented in the distribu-tion of its favors. It directly appropriates or provides for the immediate expenditures of nearly \$14,000,000 for river and harbor work. This sum is in addition to appropriations contained in another bill for similar purposes amounting to a little more than \$3,000,000, which have already been favorably considered at the present session of congress. The result is that the contemplated immediate expenditures for the objects mentioned amount to about

"A more startling feature of this bill is its authorization of contracts for river and harbor work amounting to more than \$69, 000,000. Though the payments on these contracts are in most cases so distributed that they are to be met by future appropriations, more than \$8,000,000 on their ac-count are included in the direct appropria tions above mentioned. Of the remainder nearly \$20,000,000 will fall due during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1898, and amounts somewhat less in the years immediately succeeding. A few contracts of like character, authorized under previous statutes, are still outstanding; and to meet payments on these more than \$4,000,000 must be appropriated in the immediate

future.

"If, therefore, this bill becomes a law, the obligations which will be imposed on the government, together with the appropriations made to immediate expenditure on account of rivers and harbors, will amount to about \$80,000,000. Nor is this all. This bill directs numerous surveys and examinations which contemplate new work and further contracts and which portend largely increased expenditures and obligations.

"In view of the obligation imposed upon me by the constitution it seems to me quite clear that I only discharge a duty to our people when I interpose my disapproval of the logislation proposed. Many of the ob-jects for which it appropriates public money are not rolated to the public welfare, and many of them are palpably for the benefit of limited localities, or in aid of individual interests.

"While those intrusted with the management of public funds in the interest of all the people can hardly justify questionable expenditure for public work by pleading the opinions of engineers or others as to the practicability of such work, it appears that some of the projects for which appropriations are proposed in this bill have been entered upon without the approval or against the objections of the examining charineers. I learn from official While those intrusted with the manamining engineers. I learn from official sources that there are appropriations contained in the bill to pay for work which No. 80 " Urinary Diseases private parties have actually agreed with No. 77 " Coldens of Col the government to do, in consideration of their occupancy of public property. "I am convinced that the bill now under

consideration opens the way to insidious and increasing abuses, and is in itself so extravagant as to be especially unsuited to these times of depressed business and resulting disappointment in government Centre street.

'To the extent that the appropriations contained in this bill are instigated by pri-vate interests and promote local or indi-vidual projects, their allowance canno-full to stimulate a victous paternalism, and encourage a sentiment among our people, already too prevalent, that their attachment to our government may prop-erly rest upon the hope and expectation of direct and especial favors.
"I believe no greater danger confronts

us as a nation than the unhappy decadence among our people of genuine trust-worthy love and affection for our govern-ment as the embodiment of the highest and best aspirations of humanity and not as the giver of gifts, and because its mis-sion is the enforcement of exact justice and equality, and not the allowance of unfair favoritism.

"I hope I may be permitted to suggest at a time when the issue of government bonds to maintain the credit and financial stand of the country is a subject of criti-cism, that the contracts provided for in this bill would create obligations of the United States amounting to \$60,000,000, no

less binding than its bonds for that sum.

The managers of the bill intend to move the reference of the veto mossage to the committee on rivers and harbors and bring it before the house on Monday. Found Guilty of the Murder of Johanna Logue.

A MYSTERY FOR SIXTEEN YEARS

Then the Mardered Woman's Body Was Found Beneath the Floor of a House Where Catalar Admits He Bad Buried It, Declaring Her Death Accidental,

PHILADELPHIA. May 30.—Alphonso Cutality, Jr., was last night-convicted of murder in the first degree for killing Johanna Legue, his aunt, and the wife of the notarious buggiar, "Jimmy" Logue. The orimo was committed in February, 1879, and for sixteen years was enveloped in mystery. On Oct. 16, 1893, a carpenter repairing the house at No. 1250 North Eleventh street for up some boards from the kitchen floor and found the skeleton of Johanna Logue. and found the skeleton of Johanna Logue and found the skeleton of Johanna Logue.
It became known that Logue and his wife
had lived in the house years before, and
suspicion pointed to him, but all search for
him fallod. On the night of March 5, 1885. Logue surrendered himself to Coroner Ashbridge. When he hoard he was wanted, he said, he came straightway from the west to give himself up and aid in the detection of the real mumberer. In consenunce of his subsequent statements Cuinr was arrested.

Years ago Logue bought the Eleventh street house and fitted up the first floor as a barber shop for Curalar, who was his stepson. Logue and Johanna lived there with him. In February, 1879, these two wont to New York. They parted there, Legue going to Beston on a burglary trip and the woman returning to this city. Almost immediately after her arrival here she disappeared, and was never again seen

and spent much money in the fruitless search. The mystery remained unsolved until the finding of the bones and the con-

sequent developments.

It was proved that the woman had on her person at the time she was killed \$4,000 in government bonds, and valuable jowerry. The charge was that Cutalar had murdered her to secure this property.


