## DEMOCRATS UNSEATED.

Two More Ousted from the House of Representatives.

NOT A DEMOCRAT FROM ILLINOIS

the Only Member of the Administration Party from That State Succeeded by a Republican-Senator Morgan Urges Sending Warships to Caba to Release Competitor

WASHINGTON, June 6.-The house yes terday unseated two more Democrats, Mr Lockhart, from the Seventh North Caro-

Lockhart, from the Seventh North Carslina district, and Mr. Downing, from the Sixteenth Illinois district, and seated in the place of the former Mr. Martin, a Populist, who had been indersed by the Republicans, and in place of the latter Mr. Rinaker, a Republican. Mr. Downing was the only Democrat from Illinois. A good deal of partisan feeling was aroused among the Democrats by the rulings of Mr. Payne of New York, who was temporarily in the chair, and on one of two occasions there was a mild reminder of the turbulent scenes of the Frity-first congress. The Democrats left the hall in an effort to break a quorum, but Mr. Payne declined to recognize the point of no quorum or to entertain the appeal from his decision. Mr. Grosvonor's resolution calling on the president and the cabinet ministers for a complete list of the removals from office since March 3, 1868, was altered. als from office since March 3, 1863, wa

Owing to the pressure of members for the passage of bills of local importance to them, and the refusal of Mr. Kem, of Nebraska, to consent to this character of leg islature, a special order was adopted mak ing today an individual suspension day.

Mr. Morgan gave the senate a spirited revival of the Cuban question yesterday, after which most of the day was spent in waiting for conference agreements on appropriation bills. Mr. Morgan neged the adoption of his resolution calling on the president for information of the Americans taken on the Competitor, and now under sentence of death at Havana.

The senator asserted that the president' inaction was a violation of law. Mr. Mor gan declared that congress should not ad journ without authorizing the president to send warships to Cuba to demand the release of American prisoners. On the suggestion of Mr. Sherman chairman of the committee on foreign relations, the senate went into executive session, where, after a further argument by Mr. Morgan, his resolution was placed on the calendar, a parliamentary move equivalent to post-

poning action.

After a brief period of fillbustering the immigration bill was made the unfinished immigration bill was made the unfinished business of the senate, although the debate on it was not begun. The question of electing senators by the people was discussed by Senators Mitchell, Perkins, Chandler, Palmer and Hawley. Driven from Home by a Cloudburst. Salina, Kan., June 6.—Gypsum City, a small town seventeen miles southeast of here, was visited by a cloudburst about midnight. The town was flooded anti-peo-ple were compelled to flee from their houses. Water run through the Main street two feet deep. Farms along Gyp-sum creek for miles are covered with from four to ten feet of water, and the farmers are leaving their houses in boats. At Brookville, eighteen miles west, John Cur-tis, his wife and their three children and the family of a rathroad man named Shiek barely escaped drowning. At Ellsworth a repetition of last year's flood, when great damage was done, is feared.

The St. Paul Makes a New Record.

New York, June 6.—The American line steamer St. Paul has succeeded in estab-lishing a new record between Southampnshing a new record between southamp-ton and New York. This vessel arrived in port yesterday afternoon, making the run from the Needles to Sandy Hook lightship in 6 days, 5 hours and 38 minutes. The New York, of the same line, has held the record for 6 days, 7 hours and 14 minutes since Sept. 14, 1894. This time was made over the short course of 3,047 knots.

Declined a German Decoration.

LONDON, June 6.-The Daily Chronicle prints a dispatch from Paris saying that M. Herbette, the retiring French ambas-sador at Berlin, has refused to accept from Emperor William the proffered decoration of the Red Eagle, because, as a Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor, he is entitled to a higher decoration. M. Herbette's re-call from the German capital was due to the fact that he had rendered himself extremely obnoxious to the emperor and the German officials with whom he came in

to Capture the Stronghald of the Repuis HOME REMEDIES Futile Attempt of General Arloso's Force He-The Spaniards Repulsed with Heavy Loss in Killed and Wounded.

this city were considerably elated today over the arrival of authentic news confirming the safe landing of the last expedition, carried by the steamer Thre Friends. The information came directly from Dr. Portuondo, sub-secretary of the Republican government, who is now with President Cisneros Betaneourt at Cubitas

A second letter tells of the preparations that had been made for several weeks by the Spanish commander in Puerto Prinripe, General Mella, with the idea of at-tacking and capturing the naturally forti-fied rebel capital. Without waiting to at-tack with his entire force General Mella sent Brigadior General Arleso ahead, with 2,000 infantry and 400 cavalry, to storm the outposts at the foot of Cubitas mountain, seven miles from the headquarters of the Cuban government. The total Cuban force at Cubitas numbered less than 1,00 men, but the supply of arms and ammuni-tion was ample, and a few light cannon

were advantageously placed among the huge rocks far up on the mountain side. General Arloso left the city of Puerte Principe on May 26, and on the 28th was encumped near the Pase Maril, named in honor of the late Cuban prosident. He did not attempt an attack that night, but on the morning of the 29th the Cuban guns began a fire and he ordered a forward movement. For two hours the first en-circling ridge of the mountain protected the troops, but when Arloso's men reached the second plain a flores fire from the rocky ramparts above withered his col-umns and he ordered a hearty retreat Many of the Spanish dead and wounded were carried away by their comendes, but over a hundred were left among the rocks

and chapperal on the second plain.

On the morning of the 30th Arloso moved in the direction of Puerto Principe, and a second attack is not expected by President Cisheros. The latter viewed the battle from the summit of Cubitas, and, the lotter declares, is much elated over the tell ing victory.

Vale's Crew Starts for Healey

NEW HAVEN, Conn., June 6.—The departure of Yalo's crow for Henley last night was the grandest ovation ever given to a Yale athletic team. A band led the procession, followed by the senior and junior classes in a body; next came the erew in carriages and then the sophomores and freshmen. There were fully 2,500 students in line and as many more friends of the students bringing up the rear, all marching locked arm in arm, fifteen to twenty abreast. When the band struck up popular Yale airs pandemonium reigned. Cheering, singing and the fa-miliar Yale cheers were continuous from the start to the finish. The line of much was made brilliant by red fire. The crew had difficulty in reaching their special car, so dense was the surging crowd. The crow sailed from New York this morning.


