Egyptian Troops Have a Big Fight with the Khalifa's Forces.

FULLY A THOUSAND MEN SLAIN.

The Troops Marci on Picket in the Night. and Capture the Place After a flatile Lasting an Hour and a Raif-The Loss of the Egyptians Very Smath

FIRKET, Egypt, June 8.—This point was taken by Egyptian props at an early hour yesterday morning, and their mainter of acquitting themselves in this, the first on-gagement of the Nile campaign, has given satisfaction to the British officers in com-mand of them. The Egyptian forces left Akasheh, the Egyptian outpost, Saturday evening. The distance is twenty miles, and it took the whole night to accomplish

In consequence, the arrival of the Egyptians at the dervish camp took the anemy completely by surprise They quickly rallied, however, and rushed to their arms. They stood to their positions and made a stubborn defense of the camp for an hour and a half, during which there was hard fighting.

The dervishes were finally put to rout The dervishes were finally put to rout by a final movement executed by the cav-airy. The forces of the khalifa took flight towards Suarda, pursued by the cavalry. Suarda is nearly a hundred miles south of here, but it is strongly held by a force of several thousand dervishes.

several thousand dervishes.

Reports so far received indicate that the loss to the dervishes will amount to a thousand men. Among those killed is Einir Hammuda, who was their commander, besides many important chiefs. The Egyptian loss was twenty killed and

eighty wounded.

The dervisies made a hard fight, with a large force of riflemen, and not only held their ground, but attempted to advance with a perfect roar of muskerry, which was repulsed by Shrapuell and Maxim hall and steady converging volleys, which shattered the mid houses of Firster. The position of the dervisies was storned from the north, and the remnant of the dervisies made a running fight through
