SENATE AND HOUSE AGREE

Conference Reports Agreed to, and the End is Now in Sight. WASHINGTON, June 10.—The senate yesterday agreed to final conference reports on the naval and Indian appropriation bills, leaving only the sundry civil and the District of Columbia conference reports outstanding.

The resolution for an inquiry into the circumstances of the award of the status of General William T. Sherman

was passed by the senate yesterday. The resolution was introduced by Mr. Sherman of California, and was supported by the American Sculptors, Senators Allison, Hawley and Mills defended the award.

An effort to pass one of the pension bills recently vetoed by the president

failed through the absence of a quorum. The house gave its final approval to conference reports on two of the four appropriation bills which were in issue—the naval and Indian bills. A vote taken on one of the senate public building amendments to the sundry civil bill (Savannah) just prior to adjournment indicates that the opposition to those amendments in the house is waning, and that the house will on the next vote agree to them.

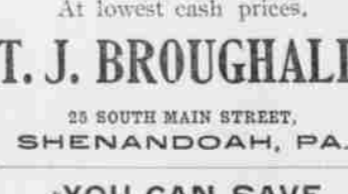
