The most bilter contest was that of the two Delaware delegations, led respectively by Senator Higgins and J. Edward Ad-dicks. The discussion throughout bristled

with bitter personalities. Mr. Addicks, speaking for himself, said he had been a Republican since the days of Lincoln, for whom he had voted, and that he had been a Republican voter in Dela-ware for nineteen years. He had become tired of the sneers cast upon him and had undertaken to make an appeal to the moderated to make an appeal to the na-tional convention, intending, if defeated, to retire from politics. He had succeeded and was here to appeal to have his cause sustained.

Mr. Higgins assorted that Addicks had elected the delegates to the convention open fraud and bribery. He admitted that the Addicks convention was regularly called and convened, but said it was irregular in its proceedings. He said also that his convention was a bolting convention. Asked by a member of the committee how he could recould his claims to this ad-mitted state of affairs, he replied that "fraud vittates all things," hence the Re-publican committee could afford to take






