apolis Manual Training school boys, and used at the Minneapolis convention.
The report of the committee on credentials was then presented. It recommended the acceptance of the roll of delegates prepared by the national committee, and in the Delaware contest seated the Higgins delegation, while from Texas the delegation headed by John Grant was declared the legal delegation. Mr. Hepburn, of Iowa, presented a minority report in a vigorous speech, dwelling especially on the claims of the Addicks delegation from Delaware.
Chairman Fort, of the credentials committee, moved the previous question. The majority report was sustained by a vote of 500 to 100.
The announcement that the committee had decided to seat Dupont in the convention as a rebuke to Addicks for preventing Dupont from becoming senator was received with cheers.
The first test of strength between the McKinley and Morton followers was on the adoption of the report of the committee on credentials. It demonstrated the fact, after all, that the candidates have a clear majority of over a hundred in the convention.
The lines were not drawn absolutely, as quite a number of the delegates who are pledged to McKinley voted with the opposition, notably the Maryland delegation, but it was apparent from the cheers with which the opposition greeted the announcement of every vote in their favor that they were marshaling every available vote at their command. They realized that they could not overthrow the victorious hosts of McKinley, and made no attempt to emphasize their disaffection by demanding a roll call on its final adoption.
This leaves the battle royal over the platform and the nominating of the candidates. It is probable that the platform would also have been disposed of last night had it not been that a night session would have intervened with the mammoth McKinley parade previously arranged for. But it had been raining all day, and a steady drizzle continued all the evening. Consequently there were only about 5,000 men in line. A flag of Cuba carried in the parade was uproariously greeted on every hand.
Nothing could have been in more striking contrast with the dull, featureless session of Tuesday than the brilliant, animated and enthusiastic session of yesterday. The hall was packed to its utmost capacity with spectators keyed to the highest pitch of enthusiasm, and the hoarse roar of 12,000 voices as it came thundering down to the pit from the black wall of people on all sides, accompanied with waving of handkerchiefs, made the pulsing beat faster.
While the convention was proceeding with its work a dramatic scene was being enacted in the committee on resolutions. The group of western silver men, headed by Senator Teller, of Colorado, announced to their colleagues, when the gold plank in the platform was agreed upon by a vote of 40 to 11, that they had reached the parting of the ways, and that nothing remained for them but to withdraw from the convention.

claration when the final announcement of the break came, but instead it was the parting of old friends in sorrow, not in anger. The silver men felt themselves swept on by an irresistible fate, and with protestations of regret they cast the die. Speeches were made by Senator Teller, who joined the Republican party at its inception and who was an ardent supporter of Lincoln, and who for twenty years has represented his state in the senate of the United States as a Republican, save for two years in the cabinet of President Arthur; Senator Dubois, the handsome stalwart young senator from Idaho, whose father was nominated for secretary of state of Illinois by Abraham Lincoln; young Senator Cannon, of Utah, whose father was president of the Mormon church, and Representative Hartman, the young and vigorous congressman from Montana; Lemmon, of California; Mott, of North Carolina, the son of Dr. Mott, the secretary of the silver party, and the delegates from New Mexico, Arizona and Oklahoma had voted with them in committee, and they, too, made speeches, but did not announce their purpose to withdraw.
The scene was a most affecting one. The gold men in the committee were filled with compassion, and there was not a dry eye in the room while Senator Teller spoke. Senator Dubois, Senator Cannon and Delegate Mott broke down completely and wept like children. Senator Lodge, who replied with words of tender sympathy, as if the occasion was some great personal bereavement. He recognized Senator Teller and his colleagues, but declared firmly that the representatives of the party could not falter on that account on the money question.
When the platform is presented to the convention there will be no disposition to cut off the bolters. They are honored and respected men, whose services in the cause of the party have been long and faithful, and they will be given ample time to make their final protest before they take their departure from the party with which they have so long been allied. It is not probable that there will be any reply to the silver men, at least not an extended one. If Senator Lodge can have his way no bitterness will be engendered.
The Colorado delegation held a meeting last night and decided in positive terms to leave the convention in a body on the adoption of the plank declaring for a gold standard. Senator Teller was present, and

and told the other members of the delegation that he appreciated to the utmost the gravity of the step, and that notwithstanding their instructions to be governed by his opinion, he felt that the occasion was one when every man should be guided largely by his own opinion. The decision to go out of the convention was unanimous. The Idaho, Nevada and Montana delegations and a part of the Montana and North Carolina delegations will go out with the Colorado men.
When the silver delegates walk out of the convention today it is their purpose to hold a meeting of their own, at which they will probably place Senator Teller in the field as a candidate for the presidency on a free silver platform. A number of Populist leaders, including Chairman Taubeneck and Hon. T. M. Patterson, of Denver, are in the city, and it is understood that they will endorse the selection on behalf of that party in a public address. The only obstacle standing in the way of this course is the fact that Senator Teller has not yet given his assent.
The general belief is that the convention will adjourn today. The prevailing opinion continues to be that Governor Morton will be McKinley's running mate on the ticket, although the friends of Hobart and Evans still insist otherwise, and the anti-Platt faction in New York is bitterly fighting Morton's nomination. It is believed that Mr. Hanna is opposed to Morton, and this fact furnishes the chief grounds for the confidence of the anti-Morton delegates.
The vice presidential situation bids fair to take the convention out of the featureless rut which has so far marked the sessions. It is as pretty a three-cornered fight as has been seen in a long while, and although Platt adherents, with a courage obtained from the leader who never seems to back it, claim that if Morton wants it, he can have it, it is nevertheless patent that they feel that Mr. Reed would be the candidate if his consent to take the place was obtained.
The New Jersey delegation, with their candidate, Garrett A. Hobart, are claiming everything for him. Nor is this latter element dismayed at the Platt claims of victory for their candidate. It is asserted by them that they will effect a combination that will destroy Morton's chances. The Evans adherents are not out of the race, and a portion of the Ohio delegation that is averse to Platt and Morton are working energetically. The confidence of the Platt men is, however, a trifle disheartening to the more incipient bolters, because it is thoroughly well known that Mr. Platt will never stand a second hearing, and will not put Mr. Morton in the race for vice president unless his positive that he has enough votes to elect him.
Hanna still maintains his silence as to which side of the New York state controversy he will endorse, claiming that until his candidate receives the nomination it would be both unwise and unpolitical for him to do so. The Miller men assert that he will not under any circumstances aid Mr. Platt, and Platt himself believes this, seeing that the Miller people were his chief supporters in New York state. But the Quay, Lodge, Alger, Platt combination is very strong, and probability of winning seems bright.
PREPARED FOR A NOISY TIME.
Many Ohioans Will Flock to Major McKinley's Canton Home.
CANTON, O., June 18.—There was high tension in the average Canton mind all day yesterday, growing out of a feeling that the nomination was likely to occur last night. The streets were thronged all day and until late at night. Citizens have all in readiness for the demonstration which is to be made, and are impatiently awaiting the special alarm of fire of the fire alarm service, arranged as a signal to press the buttons or pull the levers of the noise making devices.
Like wildfire the desire of admirers of McKinley to come to Canton to join in ratification meetings, when the nomination shall have been made, is spreading in this and adjacent states. Among the first cities to arrange to make a hurried pilgrimage to Canton, in order to show proper appreciation of the choice of the Republican standard bearer, were Akron, Alliance and Warren. But Niles, the lively little city which claims McKinley as its own, by reason of it being his birthplace, was not to be left in the rear, and at once set about to move towards Canton in a solid mass when the expected news shall have been received at that place.
News from Steubenville comes that the J. J. Gail Republican club of that city desires to join in any ratification that is held here, but the people there want to have their day's notice of the dates, so that they may prepare to come in a way that will make a proper showing. They have been notified that the demonstration of the Cleveland men is to be on the 27th, and are expected to arrange to be here on that day.
At a meeting of the Republican clubs of Wheeling, W. Va., it was decided that a train will be chartered and the party will come here on Wednesday next. They say several hundred men from that city will come, and that they will be joined by many of the iron and glass workers of Wheeling, Belleair, Martin's Ferry, Bridgeport and other adjacent towns. Michael Lally, the North Lawrence man who started the whistle blowing when the McKinley special train from this city passed through that village on Saturday night, has not run short of fuel. He has promised to keep it sounding until the news of the nomination of his favorite is announced.
The business houses in the city are beginning to decorate in honor of the anticipated nomination of Major McKinley.
VIEWS OF SOME OF THE LEADERS.
They Tell of Advantages Gained by Declaring for Gold.
ST. LOUIS, June 18.—Some of the leaders were asked last night to give their views upon the situation. They follow:
Mark Hanna—"The quiet and good natured manner in which the convention today proceeded demonstrates that the party is united for a great victory this time for McKinley. The platform, I believe, will be acceptable to every good citizen and patriotic American and to every business man."
Thomas C. Platt—"Without disparaging whoever may be the nominee of the Republican party, the next president of the United States, I believe that the east could have secured the nomination of some of the leaders had they not wavered. So far as I have seen the platform is a thoroughly good one. Our insistence upon the gold issue has secured for us a plank that will be invaluable before the business men of the United States."
J. H. Manly—"The eastern Republicans have won a great victory in this convention in forcing the convention to accept and declare for the maintenance of the gold standard. Mr. Platt, of New York, and Mr. Lodge, of Massachusetts, led the fight with earnestness and vigor, and are entitled to great credit. The party has taken the stand for the right, but matter what the result may be, but in this case to be right will be popular."
M. S. Quay—"Pennsylvania has fought here for a gold standard that would mean safety to the business and financial interests of the east. We are satisfied with the plank and generally with the platform, and any candidate should win on such a platform."
Warner Miller—"I believe the men who are to make McKinley president on an admirable platform should refuse to barter and trade with the New York state politician who has maliciously assailed their candidate, and should refuse to accept his candidate."
Henry C. Lodge—"The victory won by the eastern states in forcing the world 'gold' in the platform is one that every business man and financier in the United States will appreciate fully. We believe it is a great victory."
General Campos Recalled.
MADRID, June 18.—The government has decided to recall General Martinez Campos to active military service. The general himself declares that he will only accept the command of a division in Cuba.

PARIS, June 18.—A dispatch received here from Tunis announces that a report is current there that the Marquis de Mores, well known in New York and in the western part of the United States, has been killed south of Tripoli. It is added that all of de Mores' party, to the number of thirty-five, were massacred. He was on his way, according to report, to the Sudan in order to enlist Arab chieftains against the British.
West Virginia Free Silver Democrats.
WHEELING, W. Va., June 18.—Four Democratic district conventions selected delegates yesterday to the Chicago Democratic national convention, and all four declared unequivocally for the free and unlimited coinage of silver. The conventions were as follows: Clarkburg, W. Va., First district; Davis, W. Va., Second district; Hinton, W. Va., Third district; Point Pleasant, W. Va., Fourth district.
The Populists' Sergeant-at-Arms.
ST. LOUIS, June 18.—John Hugh McDowell, of Union City, Tenn., has been appointed sergeant-at-arms of the People's party national convention, which meets here next month. He will also serve as sergeant-at-arms of the national committee immediately after the Republican convention. Mr. McDowell will open headquarters at the rooms of the national committee by the middle of next week.
A Dangerous Counterfeit.
WASHINGTON, June 18.—Another issue of the counterfeit \$20 United States note discovered some months ago has appeared, with some changes. The words "register of the treasury" and "treasurer of the United States" have been added in the new issue and the rounded white space above the shield, held by the female figure, right and end of note, has been transferred to the left side of the shield.
Venezuela's Reported Comp.
KINGSTON, Jamaica, June 18.—According to advices received here the territory in dispute between Great Britain and Venezuela has been entered by a force of troops of the latter country. The Venezuelan soldiers compelled a party of British surveyors who were at work in the district to suspend operations. The surveying party retreated and appealed to the authorities for support.
Suspected Filibuster.
NEW YORK, June 18.—The American schooner W. Whitford, recently seized at Congo, Colombia, on suspicion of having contraband goods on board, reached this port yesterday. The schooner was detained eighteen days by the Colombian authorities. Captain Hendrick refuses to make any statement of the affair, saying that the vessel's owners are alone in a position to talk.
Another Alleged Filibustering Expedition.
MIAMI, Fla., June 18.—The schooner Queen of the West, which sailed from here Monday night, is reported to be freighted with a galling gun and a large quantity of munitions of war for the Cubans. There were thirty-five men on board, of whom twenty were Americans, the others being Cubans. Captain John Adams, of Key West, was in command.
The Alleged Bermuda Filibusters.
NEW YORK, June 18.—Judge Bennett, in the United States court, set the trial of John D. Hart, Captain John O'Brien, Mate Edward Murphy and Emilio Nunez, jointly indicted for aiding and abetting a military expedition to Cuba by means of the filibustering steamship Bermuda, for Monday next. The men were arrested in Philadelphia.
Postmaster's Shortage Made Good.
ATLANTIC CITY, June 18.—The bondsman of Postmaster Richard Sayre, whose accounts were found \$1,111.68 short, made good the amount yesterday. Sayre will resign, and Colonel Clark, the acting official, will be recommended to fill the vacancy. Assistant Postmaster Harry Postall will also resign.
New Jersey Veterans on Parade.
ASBURY PARK, June 18.—In the parade of Grand Army veterans here today there were 114 posts in line, including about 4,800 men. This evening there will be a campfire. The election of officers will occur tomorrow.
