A DEMAND ON SPAIN.

She Must Make Reparation for In-dignities to Americans.

ACTION ON THE DELGADO CASE

As Presented to the State Department by the Circumstances Bring Out Important Phases—Offense to American Citizenship. WASHINGTON, June 20.—Instructions of a direct and positive character have been sent to the United States minister at Madrid, Mr. Hannis Taylor, to make strong representations to the Spanish government for redress to the Spanish government for indignities to Dr. Jose Delgado and other American citizens in Cuba. The instructions were sent by mail some days ago, and should reach Madrid about the present time. A cablegram has been sent to Mr. Taylor, at Paris, asking that he return to Madrid as soon as he is able to travel, in order to attend to the matter. It is understood the purpose is not so much to press a pecuniary claim at a time when Spain is embarrassed as it is to insist in the rights of full protection to the persons of American citizens in Cuba. Mr. Olney's instructions were sent before meeting Dr. Delgado and his father, who are now in the city, but their presence here affords an opportunity to secure such full detail of the indignity as may become desirable when Mr. Taylor acts on his return to Madrid.

The circumstances of the case as presented to the department bring out some important phases not shown in the reports from Havana which preceded the arrival of the Delgados. The customary criticism against General Weyler is varied in this instance by full approval of the energetic steps taken by him to afford the Delgado's every aid toward reparation. At the suggestion of Consul General Lee and on the advice of Dr. Rodeygers, their counsel here, they came to Washington to make a personal statement to the secretary. They have shown to Mr. Olney the machete which was broken in the blow across Delgado's face, the bullet which he received on the first volley, and a photograph of Dr. Delgado on a stretcher after being taken from the place of shooting. These have lent a graphic interest to their recital of the events.

The action of Mr. Olney in instructing Minister Taylor places the case above one of a pecuniary character, such as a claim. Under the rules of the department a claim for pecuniary damages must state a fixed sum, with the circumstances of the claim. It is believed, however, that in the Delgado case the pecuniary claim for damage to the Delgado plantation, etc., will be subordinate to the personal indignity involved, which is construed as serious mainly through its offense to American citizenship. After that is settled the pecuniary loss of the Delgados doubtless will be the subject of a claim for indemnity.

A Trio of Forgers. LOCK HAVEN, Pa., June 20.—David Frazier, arrested here yesterday for attempting to pass a forged check for \$138 and another for \$102 on merchants. He afterwards made a confession in which he stated that he and a swindler named George Irwin, and a woman, have passed checks on different persons in Potter county, obtaining over \$700. He said they also operated at Kilmira, Williamsport and other places, under various aliases. The woman registered at hotels as Irwin's sister. She forged the checks, while the two men passed them. Irwin and the woman went to Baltimore, and meanwhile Frazier went to operate in the towns west of Williamsport. All were to meet in Baltimore in a few days to swindle on a larger scale.

MORGAN'S TESTIMONY.

The Banker Before the Bond Investigating Committee.

HIS ACTION WHOLLY PATRIOTIC.

NEW YORK, June 20.—J. Pierpont Morgan bonded yesterday before the senate bond investigating committee. When his inquiry reached the period of the bond issue of last year Mr. Morgan told of his consultation with Assistant Secretary Curtis on the occasion of that official's first visit to New York. Mr. Curtis said Mr. Morgan, seemed to realize the imminence of a financial crisis, and asked him if he would undertake to float a loan. Mr. Morgan continued: "I told Mr. Curtis that I felt bound to do so. I had prepared a memorandum of a private contract to be submitted to the president and Secretary Carlisle for approval. Mr. Curtis returned to Washington, and in the meantime affairs here were culminating rapidly. Nearly \$6,000,000 in gold was shipped to Europe the day following Mr. Curtis' return to Washington, leaving less than \$10,000,000 of the gold reserve available. A day or two later, when it became whispered about that Mr. Belmont and my firm were about to take up a loan, the outward flow of gold stopped almost immediately, and it is only fair to say that confidence was largely restored."

In those preliminary negotiations the understanding was that the syndicate should pay 3 1/2 per cent. premium for the bonds, but a few days later a letter was received from Secretary Carlisle, saying that it had been decided to abandon negotiations. This necessitated Mr. Belmont's visit to Washington, and at the same time Mr. Morgan wrote to Secretary Carlisle, saying "that in view of what we had already done we were entitled to some consideration at his hands. Our request for delay was granted, and the next week Mr. Belmont, Mr. Stetson and I went to Washington and saw the president, Secretary Carlisle and Attorney General Olney."

Mr. Morgan then stated the conditions of the contract under which the syndicate took the bonds, no facts not already known being given. Mr. Morgan declined to say what the profits of the transaction were, on the ground that after the bonds came into the possession of the syndicate the public interest in them ceased. No one connected with the government, he added, was interested with the syndicate, directly or indirectly.

To Senator Platt Mr. Morgan reiterated that he had no objection in doing what he did in the matter of the bond loan except to prevent a panic and save the credit of the country. He thought that the government could not have made better terms than those made with his syndicate. Conrad N. Jordan, assistant United States treasurer in this city, was asked about the alleged tender made by William Graves. "Mr. Graves came to me and said, 'If you do so, and so I will do so and so.' It was all talk, and I declined to deal with him."

"Did anybody else see you about Mr. Graves' bid?" "Yes, the Messrs. Laidlaw, also a representative of the firm of Laidlaw, Thelmer & Co. The representative of the latter firm offered a proper tender, provided they could have the bonds indorsed directly to them. Graves' bid was signed 'Graves and Associates.' It seems he had no associates. It was all talk and no money was tendered."

Mr. Graves, who was again present and sat directly back of Mr. Jordan, asked twice to interrogate Mr. Jordan. Permission was granted. Graves then asked Mr. Jordan whether it was not true that he had asked to make his order for the bonds a "special" one, as had been done in other cases. Mr. Jordan admitted that this might be so, but that his (Graves') tender was not regular.

Cashier H. C. Chapin, of the Third National bank of this city, against which bank Mr. Graves made the accusation that bonds had been awarded on a temporary receipt, made plain that Mr. Graves' charges were unfounded, and denied the conspiracy in toto. James T. Woodward, president of the Hanover National bank of this city, against which institution Graves had also made charges of conspiracy, ridiculed the charges.
