THE BOUNDARY DISPUTE. It Is Aggravated by the Recent Arrest of a British Surveyor.

PROBABLY AN ENGLISH SCHEME.

The Crown Surveyor Was Evidently Engaged in Improving the Lines of Communication Between the Seaboard and the Disputed Territory.

GEOBGETOWN, British Gulana, June 34 .-Harrison, the British official who was arrested by an armod force of Venezuelans on June 15, is the crown surveyor. The affair has caused much indignation and excitement here, although nobody seems surprised at the incident, as the Venezue-lans have repeatedly declared that they intended to put a stop to British read mak-ing in or about the disputed territory. It is pointed out here that Harrison was

It is pointed out here that Harrison was working, with a force of about a hundred laborers and engineers, well within the Schomburgk line, opening up a road from the Barima to the Cuyuni river. When notified by the commander of a force of Venezuelan troops to stop work Harrison did so under profest, and promptly entered into communication with Sir Augustus Hemming, the new governor of British Guiana. Governor Hemming notifist Harrison to offer no resistance to the Venezuelans, who claims i the right to ar-rest foreigners on the left bank of the rest foreigners on the left bank of the Cuyuni river. Harrison carried out his instructions, but his arrest seems to have followed upon the receipt of additional instructions from Caracas.


It was this movement of the Venezuelan roops and the arrest of Harrison which led, it is said, to the alarming reports of the advance of Venezuelan troops into the the advance of Venezueian troops into the disputed territory, which rumors were fol-lowed by the circulation of stories of san-guinary encounters between the British and Venezueians. The reports of blood-shed, however, are not believed at George town, although it is quite possible that there may have been a clash between Har-rison's laborers and the Venezuelans. The colonial officials state that no British have crossed the Schomburgk line except to visit the Venezuelans or to send them help, as in the case of the recent fire at El Dorado, when half that station was destroyed. The feeling here is that Great Britain cannot delay action much longer,

as the Venezuelans, according to the British, seem determined to provoke a con-flict without waiting for the report of the United States commission. On the other hand, unbiased judges of the situation hold that the crown surveyor and his 100 laborers might very well have been kept here until all danger of a conflict was passed, and that the work of sur-veying and road building, even near the disputed territory, was calculated to ex-cite the Venezuelans and cause further trouble at a moment when a spark is liable

to start a moment when a spark is moment to start a most serious conflagration. No military man is foolish enough to really pretend that the crown surveyor was engaged in the work other than that was engaged in the work other than that of preparing for eventualities by improv-ing the lines of communication between the seaboard and the territory in dispute, and therefore it seems difficult to biame the Venezuelans for having put a stop to Harrison's operations. In fact, it is rumored that the crown surneyor's arrest was not ordered until it became plain that bit outward atoming of work and retreat his outward stopping of work and retreat under protest were merely moves intended to deceive the Venezuelans, and that he to deceive the venezuerans, and that he was pushing the surveying and road mak-ing secretly, while apparently having stopped work in obedience to the remon-strances of the Venezuerans.

The actual facts in the case, naturally are kept secret by the British officials, who It is understood, have cabled a full report on the subject to the colonial office. The people here are rapidly getting tired of the whole dispute, especially of the bungling treatment which the really serious boundary dispute is receiving in London, and it is feared that the hands of all concerned may be forced, sooner or later, by a con-flict on the border which might have been avoided had the dispute between British Guiana and Venezuela been handled more promptly and effectively by the home gov-


