THE SILVER CONFERENCE BEGUN.

Democrats Who Favor the White Metal Meet to Arrange with the National Committee for Proper Recognition in the Democratic National Convention.

CHICAGO, June 39 .- The lenders of the CHICAGO, June 39.—The leaders of the Democratic silver forces in the various states met in the Shorman House in this city today, under the auspices of the himotalite Democratic national committee. The meeting is not to be of as general a character as has been supposed. It will be composed in a large measure of representatives of the bimotalite committee which was organized by Washington has been supposed. was organized in Washington last August, and there will also be present other leading silver Democrats, to whom invitations

have been especially extended.

Meetings will probably be held daily un; Moctings will probably be held daily un; til the beginning of the convention, and possibly while the convention continues if there appears to be occasion for them. The general purpose of the meetings is to exercise a supervisory care over the inter-ests of the silver cause in the Democratic

convention.

The conference was first decided upon two months ago, when the sliver people were not so sure of being able to control

the convention as they now are. It was considered important at that time that the silver people should have such a perfect understanding that there would be no doubtful moves made in the convention or elsewhere. Now they profess to feel so sure of their ground that they do not longer feel the necessity for such caution. Among the matters to which they do propose to give their attention are the contests for seats in the convention made by silver men, and the selection of a temporary chairman of the convention and possibly later to the preparation of a pinthern, and if measury the selection of a candidates.

and if necessary the selection of candidates.

Major T. O. Towles, of Missouri, why is secretary of the radional limetallic Democratic committee, said in conversation that probably the first work of the committee would be the appointment of subcommittee to confor with the national Democratic committee, with the view of securing harmonious action in the convention. "Whatever the predilections of the national committee," said he, "I suppose they will show no disposition to deprive the silver majority of the convention of its right to name the temporary chairman, and to exercise other rights belonging to the majority, but if such a dislonging to the majority, but if such a dis-position should be manifested it would be resented, and the silver men would undoubtedly name a candidate of their own for presiding officer. Furthermore, they would elect him."

"I am, of course, for Mr. Bland," he continued, "and our delegation are instructed for him, but if we cannot get him we shall get some other man who is sound on the

get some other man who is sound on the currency question, and Missouri will support him at the polls."

The senator thinks that there will be a square declaration for the mintage of silver on terms of equality with gold at the ratio of 16 to 1, and without awaiting the co-operation of other nations. He laughs at Mr. Whitney's suggestion of a compromise, and says it will not be entertained. Controller Eckels reached the city yesterday and took up quarters at the Palmer
