Negroes Organized for Another Lynching in Maryland.

WANTED TO HANG A WHITE MAN

In Revenge for the Lynching of Sydney Randolph, the Alleged Assailant of the Buxton Family-Mr. Buxton, Their Intended Victim, Strongly Guarded.

Garrierssum, Md., July 6.—Sydney Randolph, a negro, charged with the brutal assault upon the Buxton family at this place on May 25 which resulted in the death of little Sadle Buxton, was taken from Bockville jail, where he was con-fined, awaiting the action of the Novemfined, awaiting the action of the November grand jury, about 2 30 Saturday morning, by a mob of thirty or forty masked men and hanged near Rockville. He went to his death without saying whether he was guilty or not of the horrible crime, his only utterances being cries of murder as he was carried by the resolute body of near from the fail. men from the fail.

The excitement caused by the lynching of Randolph, which had almost entirely died out, was stirred to a high pitch last night when it became rumored that the colored people in the vicinity of Gaitheraburg had organized a party and were going to Rockville to lynch R. L. Buxton, the father of the family that was assaulted, and of which crime Randolph was accused and for which he was lynched.

The deputy sheriff quietly informed a number of citizens that their services might be needed and then told Buxton of his danger, advising him to leave on the next train for Washington. Buxton seemed quite nervous and excited, but traditionally a seemed of the provide and excited, but traditionally are seemed of the see but protested against going to Washing

Arrivals from Galthorstong stated that the rumor of the intended outbreak among the negres had reached them, and that of the negrees had reached them, and that a party of 200 men had been armed and put on their guard. They informed Buxton that if he would accompany them back to Galthersburg they would guarantee to protect him. Buxton returned to Galthersburg, where he spent the night with friends, guarded by several able bodied men.

There is no doubt that the colored people of the county are very indignant as the lynching of Randolph, and are open in their dominication of the set. It is stated, also, that they are bitter against Buxton, claiming that he knows more about the affair than he is willing to tell.

RUSSELIVILLE, Ky., July a —A deadly duel took place near Adairville Saturday. Dock Younger went to town drunk, and as he rode out of the town he fired his pietal. H. H. Harmon, the town marshal, jumped on a horse and started after Younger. An hour later both men were hard dead absert with face. Younger. An hour laser toon men were found dead about a mile from fown. Both men had been shot through the heart, and only one chamber in each revolver had been discharged. William Younger, a brother of Dock, was killed in Adairville by Date Paterson four years ago. Harmon killed two men in Tennessee several years ago. He was the only man the town of Adarwille has had for years who could keep order.

BARAHOO, Wis., July 6.—One of the boldest and most successful robberies ever perpetrated in this county occurred in the town of Sauk City, near this place. About noon the employes of the Charles Naffz bank went to dinner. There was no one left to guard the valuables, and the robbers had an easy time in effecting an en-trance to the premises. They broke through a rear door, secured \$3,500 from one of the cash drawers, and escaped.

Elaborate Preparations for the International Convention.

WASHINGTON IN GALA ATTIRE,

It is Expected That Between Forty and Fifty Thousand Visitors Will Attend the National Capital While the Convention

Washington, July 6 -- Hetween 40,000 and 50,000 visitors to the capital city are expected during the next ten days to at-tend the sessions of the different international Christian Endeavor convention, which begins on Wednesday and continues through the 18th. A vast amount of work preparing the program for the convention and for the entertainment of the Endsav-orers has been done by the local commit-tee. From the enthusiasm which has been apparent all over the country, as disclosed by the communications that have been received by the local committee and the in-tense interest taken in the convention, it seems to be assured that the gathering

will be the greatest of its kind ever held.

The combined seating capacity of 40,000 will be available at any time during the convention, and the meeting piaces will be more numerous than heretofore. Three great tents pitched on the white lot, a government reservation just south of the president's mansion, a large hall and a number of the charebes will constitute the principal auditoriums, and at certain times meetings will be held simultaneously in all. Other churches will be utilized for early morning prayer meetings and smaller gatherings. Primarily important as meet-ing places will be the three great tents on the white lot, named respectively "Tent Williston," "Tent Endoavor" and "Tent Washington."

Each of these mammoth stretches of canyass will hold about 10,000 people. Apredximately 8,000 persons can be accommodated in the settless for the audienc modited in the settices for the auditone, while on the great platform provision will be made for 1,500 more. All the auditoriums are decorated with Christian Endeavor and United States Hags, streamers and binatings. In the tents are displayed a number of Hags of foreign nations, contributed especially for this convention by Christian Endeavor scaleties in the respective countries as an expression of the international character of the gathering. Askis from the interior decorations the

Askis from the interior decorations the citizens of Washington, particularly the merchants, have entered into the spirit of the convention and joined in making the city attractive by liberal decorations of their homes and places of basiness. Shop-windows are bright with convention rel-ors, shields and other devices in colors bearing the word "Welcome" are giveni-nently displayed, and froms of stores and

nently displayed, and from sof stores and buildings are draped. The government authorities have lent their assistance in decorating the public parks.

A prominent feature of this year's convention will be the great charms of absert 4,000 voices which has been in training for a long time for the gathering. Three sections of the chorus will assist in the slagting in the tents, and the fourth body of 1,000 voices will be divided among the other meetings in the halls and churches. Probably the most interesting feature in connection with the full chorus of 4,00 voices is an open air patriotic song service. This is to take place next Saturday vies. This is to take place next Saturday afternoon on the broad plans on the ener side of the United States Capitol building. The Marine band will lend its assistance President Francis E. Clark, D. D., of Bos ton, is to preside at the meeting. Hon John Wanameker, of Philadelphia, is to make a brief address, and President Clark is to present a banner to the local city union having reported the best work accom-

having reported the best work accomplished during the year in promoting Christian chizenship.

The program for the meetings of the convention is about completed. In general it contemplates early morning prayor meetings in the churches of the various denominations represented from 6:30 to 7:15 o'clock. From 9:30 o'clock until well on towards noon are to be held the meetings for addresses, praise, reports and the discussion of various topics in the large tents and some of the large halls and churches. In the afternoon, scattered throughout the convention, will be denominational raillies in the several churches.
