PERMANENT CHAIRMAN WHITE. Senator Hill Roceives Six Votes in the

Committee on Organization. CHICAOO, July 8.—The confinities on permanent organization met in the Col-seum immediately after the adjournment of the convention. General E. B. Finley, of Ohio, was made chairman and J. P. Brown, of Georgia, secretary. A recess was then taken and the silver men retired and held a caucus, at which the permaand hold a caucas, at which the perma-nent organization was fully agreed upon. The committee then adjourned until 8 o'clock, when it reconvened at the Sher-man House. In the evening the silver alate went through as follows: Permanent chairman, Stephen M. White of California ; sergeant-at-arms, John I. Martin of Mis-souri ; secretary, John J. Cogan of Cin-cinnait ; assistant secretary, Louis D. Horsheimer of Chicago ; reading clerk, E. B. Wade of Tennessee.




