

Hurried meetings of all the gold state delegations were called as soon as the convention adjourned in the afternoon, and the New York contingent went to a nearby club house and began work immediately. The talk of bolting the convention entirely was very loud. Congressman Charles Tracey said he would not go back, as did General Frederick Bartlett. Senator Hill said he believed the platform violated the established principles of Democracy in many more particulars than the mere adoption of a platform. To support a candidate on such a platform would mean vir-tual agreement with it. He did not be Heve that it was policy to at present so far act as to give it an indorse-ment. John R. Fellows said: "I cannot ment. John R. Fellows said: 'I cannot tee how I can support such a platform or tny person placed upon it. Mr. William C. Whitney said he was personally not averse to leaving the convention, but he would not like to have it said that New York led such a revolt. Congressman Sul-zer, who advocated adherence to the ma-loster was boated down. Security Grade jority, was hooted down. Senator Grady denounced the platform as fanaticism and Delancy Nicoll declared he would not vote for a candidate on such a platform. GROWTH OF THE ORGANIZATION.

President Clark Says That Forty-six Thonannd Societies Have Been Formed, with Five Million Members, and That Nearly Three Millions Are Now on the Rolls.

Washington, July 10.—Owing to the destruction of the big Tent Williston by the storm of Wednesday night, the pro-ceedings of the Christian Endeavor soci-ety were delayed. The early morning services yesterday were held in the various Protestant churches, as arranged. In Tent Washington there was an immouse as-semblage, and Colonel John Hay's 'Hymn semblage, and Colonel John Hay strynniof Welcome? was sung by a grand chorus. W. H. H. Smith delivered a speech of welcome, which was responded to by the Rev. R. J. Servica, of Detroit. Then Rev. Francis E. Clark, president of the organization, lannounced the program for the ization, fannounced the program for the

coming campaign.
In his address President Clark gave some interesting statistics. He said that 46,000 societies have been formed; 5,000,000 of Endeavorers have been carolled, of whom more than 2,700,000 are today members; 2,000,000 of others, Endeavorers in all but name, have probably been enrolled in purely denominational societies; 10,000,000 Endeavor meetings have been held: 5,000,000 copies of the constitution have undoubtedly been printed, in forty different languages, and at least 15,000,000 copies of the piedge; over 1,000,000 of our associate members have come into the evangelical churches connected with fifty denomina-tions, and it is certain that over \$2,000,000 have been given in benevolence through denominational and church channels.

The morning meetings in the big tent were characterized by a remarkable dis-play of enthusiasm and good feeling. In the afternoon the weather became more propitious and the sun came out bright and warm. The program called for de-nominational services in no less than twenty-eight separate places, and these were generally well attended. The Haptists and the Presbyterians had

Barbeur, of Rochester, N. X. a most enthusiastic meeting was held and stirring addresses were delivered by some of the most noted divines of the country. In Tent Endeavor the Presbyterians held out, and here also the superabundant zeal of the assembled throngs manifested itself in frequent applause of the many notable speakors and in the swinging vim with speakers and in the swinging vim with which the choruses were rendered.

The Congregationalists had lost their home with the fall of Tent Williston, but the local committee proved equal to the occasion, and provided for them hand-somely by assigning to their use the big central hall. Japan's Awful Tidal Wave,

Washington, July 10.—The Japanese minister received a telegram yesterday stating that according to official returns collected up to the 22d of last month the total loss of life caused by the tidal wave which swept the northeast coast of Japan on the 15th of June was 20.825. The number of warming and 1999. on the 15th of June was 19,822. The num-ber of persons injured was 5,703 and 5,029 houses were swept away. The loss of life and property was confined to the provinces of 'Aomori, Miyagi and Iwati, the latter being the chief sufferor. The belief is prevalent that the tidal wave was caused by an earthquake in the sea off the north-cost coast.
