

RAILROAD STATISTICS.

Interesting Facts and Figures for the Traveling Public.

A BIG DECREASE IN EARNINGS.

An Unresnally Small Number of Passen gers Killed and Injured-A Comprehensive Sistement Prepared by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Washington, July 21. - The eighth statistical report of the interstate commerce commission, prepared by its statis-tictan, for the year ended June 30, 1866. has just been submitted.

Reference is made to the effect of the tetoretee is made to the effect of the continued business depression and the large number of receiverships. On June 30, 1805, 160 roads, operating 37,855 miles, were reported in the hands of receivers, showing a net decrease of 23 roads and 2,963 miles of line during the year. The railway capital represented by these roads was marrly \$2,500,000,000, or about 22.20 percent of the total railway capital in the cent of the total rallway capital in the United States

The total railway mileage in the United States on June 30, 1895, was 189,657 miles, on Increase for the year of 1,948 miles, or 1.60 per cent, the smallest during any pre-cisiting year for which reports have been made to the commission. The aggreent length of all tracks in the United States on June 30, 1835, was 236,834 miles. The number of ratiway corporations on that date was 1,965, of which 1,013 maintained operating accounts and 800 financial accounts. During the year 14 roads were abandoned, 9 merged, 22 reorganized and 28 consolidated

The classification of railways on the basis of operated mlleage shows that 42 companies, each operating more than 1,000 miles, operate 100,714 miles of line, or 1,000 miles, operate 10,714 miles of line, or 55 67 per cent of the total railway mile-age, and that 135 roads, or 12.05 per cent of operating companies, each with a mile-age exceeding 250 miles, operate 145,155 miles, or 80.24 per cent of the total mild-in operation. The increase in number of lecomotives in service during the year was 207, the total number June 30, 1885, helion 500 or which 0.000 ceres against being 35,600, of which 9,000 were passenger locomotives and 30,019 freight. The num ber of cars of all chasses reported, being those owned by railways, was 1,770,501, a decrease of 7,517 as compared with the previous year. This decrease is not wholly due to an offert to economize in equipment, but rather to increased use of

private cars.
The number of passengers carried per passenger becomotive was 50,747, or 3,007 less than in 1884. The number of miles per passenger was 1,218,667 or 226,438 less than in 1896, while the number of passenger cars per 1,000,000 passengers carried was 65, or 12 groater than the preceding year. This is probably largely due to the decreased travel on account of business de-pression, but it also suggests that pra-senger traffic has returned to its normal conditions previous to the World's Co-lumbian exposition.

The number of men employed by rail-ways shows an increase of 5,426 as com-pact with the previous year, the number of employes being 783,034 on June 20,1805. The statistics on this point show that the effect of commercial depression upon the payrolls of railways fell most payrous a rattways too most severely upon the group comprised under the de-scription of "maintenance of way and structures," and next to this upon "main-tenance of southment."

The amount of railway capital on Juna 30, 1895, was \$10,985,200,125, or \$65,330 per mile of line, an increase during the year of \$188,720,312 The figures show an in-crease in the corporate ownership of se-curities, probably rather due to railway consolidation than to the strengthening of reserve funds

The milways of the United States closed the year with a deficit from the year's operations of \$29,845,241, which was met by a decrease in accumulated surplus or by the creation of current liabilities. The corresponding deficit of the year ending June 30, 1894, was 845,851,294
