THE VIOTIME' BODIES AT HALIFAZ.

The First Mate of the Yessel Charged with the Terrible Crime by a Member of the Crear-The Statement of a Passenger Gives Color to the Charge.

HALFAX, N. S., July 22.—The American harkoutine Herbert Fuller, which sailed from Roston a few days ago for Rosario, arrived in Halifax harbor yesterday with the bedies of three murdlered people. The balance of these who loft Roston on the vessel were immediately arrested.
