LONDON, July 23.-Princess Mand, third daughter of the Prince and Princess of Wales, was married at 19.30 o'clock yes-terday to Prince Charles, second son of Crown Prince Frederick of Denmark. The escensory took place in the private chapel

at Buckingham palace.
Crowds began to assemble in the streets at an early hour in the day, and all points of vantage along the route from Marlbor-

quickly filled. The streets, however, were leept clear for the royal procession by the Cold Stream and Scots Guards, while par-

ties of the First Life Guards were sta-tioned at intervals all along the route. So far as the general public of Lendon was concerned the wedding did not at-tract as much attention as had been bestowed upon other royal marriages of re-cent years. With the exception of St. James street and a few houses in Pall Mall

and Piccadilly the decorations were poor.
The queen's procession was the first to enter the chapel. It was composed of horalds, ushers women of the bed chamber, bearers of the gold sticks and other officials of the queen's household. With the queen walked her sen, the Duke of Connaught, and Prince Christian of Den-Commark, and Prince Christian of Den-mark. Then came another imposing pro-cession, composed of all the other royal personages, the Princess of Wales and the crown prince of Denmark, her brother and father of the bridgroom bringing up the rear.
