WHITNEY FOR A THIRD TICKET.

He Thinks the Strongth of the Free Silverites is Underestimated.

New York, July 14.—Mr. William C. Whitney was asked yesterday if, in his judgment, there would be a third ticket nominated by sound money Democrats. He replied:

"I think events and the course of the Republican leaders are making it inevitable. The general situation is far worse today, in my opinion, than it was ten days ago. The Republican managers and condidates have shown no realizing sense of the situation. They have falled to avail of a great opportunity for benefiting the country. You may call it a craze, but it has captured the imaginations of the great mass of people throughout the entire west and south, and it has a much stronger following in some partions of the cast, not closely allied to large commercial centers, than is generally supposed. I think it may be accepted as a fact that the vast majority of free slives believers at this time are not open to con-viction. Their minds are made up, and

Run Down by a Steamer and Drowned. BURLINGTON, N. J., July 23.—A drown-ing accident occurred on the Delaware river here Tuesday night, which resulted in the death of Katle Kane, of Beverly, and Lee Horner, of this city. The young couple were returning from a moonlight row down the river, and when in midstream were struck by the steamer Florence, cutting the batteau in two. Miss Kane sank immediately, but Horner, who was thrown a considerable distance from the boat, made a gallant fight for life, but gave up the struggle before aid reached him. The bodies were recovered.

Two Boys Crushed to Death. Challeston, W. Va., July 24.—Two boys, whose names are thought to be Rice and Steinburg, aged 14 and 18, respectively, were killed on a freight train at Shenandoah Junction yesterday. They boarded the train at Hagerstown and cropt under a lot of sewer piping on a flat car.

Great Destruction of Property in Washington State.

MANY LIVES PROBABLY LOST.

The Flames, Fanned by a Heavy Wind, Nov Succeping Through the Valleys - The People of Vancouver in Imminent Dangor from Bush Fires.

SPOKANE, Wash., July 84 -- A strong wind has been blowing from the cast for twenty four Lours, clearing the atmos-phere here of smoke, but in the mountains to the north the breeze has been the means of fanning the forest fires into raging walls of flame, which are sweeping across the mountains and down into the valley with terrible rapidity. When the air was still the fires were confined to the mountains and did not crosp down into the va-

leys, but now those who sought safety there are compelled to flee for flair lives. Word received from Easle and points along the Arrow takes, in British Colum-bia, is to the effect that the high wind has fanned the smouldering embers into fresh blazes, and where the miners thought they were safe, the fire having passed over they were safe, the fire having passed over them, they find themselves surrounded by flames. In some cases escape is almost impossible, and a number of deaths may be the result. On the north fork of the Falmon river nearly all the cabins and shaft houses have been burned to the ground, together with large quantities of provisions and tools. It is learned that Rossiand, B. C., is in danger. All cit-sens of the town are out in the hills try-ing to prevent the five from reaching their ing to prevent the fire from reaching their homes. Cabins within four miles of the town have been burned.

Meager reports have reached this city of fires on the Colville Indian reservation Only a few people have come down, and it is feared that many have met their death. A party came to Kettle River from Turtle Crock, and three members went back to got some bedding they had forgotten. They have not returned, and as the firs-has swept over the place it is feared that they have been lost.

The United States forestry commission is in this city, coming for the purpose of inspecting the forests, but the visitors find they cannot go out on account of the fires. From information they have of the extent of the fire they estimate the damage at many millions of dollars

Fires on Vancouver Island. Victosia, B. C., July 34.—The senthern half of Vancouver island has not seen clear atmosphere for several days owing to the bush fires everywhere raging, causing immense damage to property and making travel on country roads extremely dangerous. The worst reports of damage reached this city from Alberni. That city is surrounded by one immense fire, which has taken entire possession of Mineral Hill, a wealthy section.
