# COLORADO CLOUDBURST

It Carried Everything Before It in the Marrow Canyons.

TWENTY-NINE KNOWN TOBE DEAD.

A House with Eighteen Occupants Swept Away, and Only Our of the lumites Reseved-A Remarkable Fall of Water on a Second Visitation.

DENVER, July 27.—The cloudbursts in the foothills west of Bonver Friday night, resulting in floods in which twenty-nine people are known to have perished, was followed Saturday afternoon by another tarrible storm, the like of which has sel-dom been seen in this vicinity. According to Weather Observer Brandenburg, seve-enty hundredths of an inch of rain fell in ten misutes, beating all local records. ten minutes, beating all local records. The downpour continued with some diminished severity for half an hour, and

The downpour continued with some diminished severity for half at hour, and it rained at inservals all the afternoon.

At Morrison, seventeen miles from Denver, twenty-two persons were flowned in the flood Friday night, and people were terror stricken when they saw the sterm approaching. Half began to fall soon after 7 o'clock, and at 4 o'clock a black cloud of unusual density began is gather in the vicinity of Mt. Vernon, a few miles from Morrison. There the cloud borst, and in an instant a wall of water came down the gulch fully six fest higher than was ever seen before. Everything in its path was washed away. The raging for rent carried along with it houses, barns, trees and debris of all kinds.

Every housy in Morrison is flooded, water having spreadail over the place. Below the town there have been scarching parties along the crask seeking for the unrecovered bodies of the dead in the previous dissister, and there are fears that numbers of these parties have been caught in this last tidal ways.
