

A CONVICTS ROMANCE Secretaria

Confessed the Crime for Which Another Awaits Death.

THEN HE COMMITTED SUICIDE.

Inconsistencies in His Statement, However, Lead to the Conclusion That He Was Mentally Unbalanced When Hs (Made the Confession to the Warden.

BALTIMORE, Ang. 3.—Frederick R. Whit-ney, a convict in the Maryland peniten-tiary in this city, committed suicide on Saturday by jumping from the window of the third tier of cells to the stone floor of the yard beneath. He struck on his head, crushing his skull, and death was instantaneous. Whitney is a self confessed mur-derer as well as a highwayman. Warden Weyler says that the long term of impris-nament before him and the knowledge that his hands were stained with the blood of a fellow man doubtless unbalanced his

mind.

Whitney held up ex-Councilman Walter R. Swindell on March 28, 1805, and with his pal, John B. Williams, immediately left town. They were traced to Philadelphia, thence across the state of Ponnsylvania to Pittsburg, where they were captured on April 6. The two men were subsequently convicted and sontenced to eighteen years imperisonment.

The fatal leap on Saturday of the prisoner caused the Warden to cross-question Williams, and the latter confessed yesterday that Whitney had on April 5 murdered Henry Bonnecka. Eleven thousand dellars was scoured, which Williams asserts was burled by himself and Whitney. It is learned that there was such a man murdered in Altona at the time mentioned and that a man named Wilson was

tioned and that a man named Wilson was arrested and convicted of the crime on mainly circumstantial evidence, and is now awaiting the death sentence in Al-

It has been ascertained that Whitney's thas been ascertained that whitney is real name is Joseph Hildehrand and his home in Detrett. Six years ago, while serving a sontence for murder, he escaped from the penitentiary at Little Bock, together with nine other prisoners
