Reported from Many D. Herent Parts of the Country.

ARYANSAS LEADS THE HOT WAVE.

In the Capital of That State Yesterday the Thermometer Registered 102 Degrees. Memphis a Close Second with 100 Degrees-Many Other Places Above 90,

Washington, Aug. 6.—Reports of maximum temperatures received by the weather bureau show that the present warm wave is very general, and is probably the most severe during the present summer. The officials say it is very unusual for the temperature to reach such a high point in so many parts of the country at one time. The heat is due to an area of high barometer which has been prevailing over the southern portion of the country and low barometer in the northern parts, which results in great waves of the heat coming toward the north. WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.-Reports of max-

In this city the heat has been intense, and yesterday the thermometer reached its maximum point, registering 96 degs., ac-cording to the official readings. In business houses and other places it registered 100 above. Notwithstanding the intense heat, there were no prostrations.

The predictions of the weather bureau are that the warm weather will continue from the middle and south Atlantic coast westward to the Mississippi river, though some relief may be expected from thunder

storms in some sections.

The Hot Wave in Chicago.

CHICAGO, Aug. 6.—At 3 o'clock yester-day afternoon the thermometer registered hotter than it has at any time for two years, when it was 90 degs. This figure has only been equalled twice since 1887, when it was 100 in the shade, and the rate of mortality was greater than the undertakers could handle. The first death reported was Joseph B. Lapham, shoe dealer, of 227 West Lake street, who dropped dead near the Chiosgo Beach hotel. James Brune, assistant professor at the Chicago university, was picked up unconscious.
