HEAT VICTIMS MULTIPLY

Two Hundred More Deaths in New York and Brooklyn Alone.

That a Cool Wave Is Now Traveling Rapidly Toward Us-Some Remarkable Records for the Thermometer.

New York, Aug. 12.—Another day of the fearful heat which is oppressing this section has added a page of fatalities and suffering more remarkable than its prediscossors. In New York city, in Brooklyn and all the adjacent towns and through-out the states of New York and New Jer-sey the day's results overshadow the re-sult of any other day. In this city alone the death list for twenty-four hours, footed up at midnight, contains more than 100 names; Brooklyn adds about 20 to the list. and the heat's victims in suburban towns brings the total to 150.

Men and women walking along the streets have dropped in their tracks and died before physicians could be summoned, and horses have died as though stricken by a plague. Many factories have been closed, and outdoor workers have been compelled to drop their tools and find shelter during the hours when the sun was at its height. Particularly among pollcemen and letter carriers has the suffering been intense, and many have been compelled to stop work from both forces. Along the business streets men have

walked with umbrellas over their heads, with coats on their arms and fans in their The hospitals of this city are crowded to their full capacity, while the dectors and nurses have been kept at work night and day until many of them have succumbed to the strain.

The department of public works has come to the relief of the tenement house districts, and forces of men with hose carts are patrolling the streets of these sections and flooding them with water from the corner hydrants. Men, women and children rush in groups under the streams from the hose, and the night scenes among from the hose, and the night scenes among
the tenements as the relief parties make
their rounds are unprecedented. Unless
tonight brings relief many prostrations
are looked for in the Madison Square
Garden meeting, and preparations are beting, made for a special force of medical
men and for special ambulances.

The thermometer has for the past six
nights fallen but a few degrees from the
limits registered during the hottest part
of the day. The heat on Monday night
held almost stationary at 81 degrees until
4 o'clock yesterday morning, and as soon

4 o'clock yesterday morning, and as soon as the sun began to ascend the thermometer ad likewise, until all previous records eter ad likewise, until all previous records for Aug. II were broken. The highest previous record for Aug. II was 88 degrees in 1891 and 92 degrees in 1892, while yes-terday it registered upon the top of the Manhattan Life Insurance building, where the weather bureau is situated, 30.5 de-grees, and the humidity, which is far worse than the belling sun stood at 70, and down on the stream it was not less than down on the streets it was not less than five degrees warmer.

COOLER WEATHER PROMISED.

The Government Weather Sharp Promises to Do Better.

Washington, Aug. 12.—The weather bureau holds out moderate relief for the Major Dunwoody says it will be central over the Ohio valley and the lower lake region tonight and reach the Atlantic coast by tomorrow morning. The govern-ment weather sharp wants its understood that this is not a cold wave, but merely a relief from the excessive and almost unprecedented hot spell.

There has not been a revolution of the wind east of the moun-

tains in ten days. Altogether this protracted hot spell can be classed as remarkable. The high temperature in the prairie country has lasted twenty days, in the western gulf states a formight, and on the Atlantic seaboard a week. The highest temperatures yester-day were: Philadelphia, 98; New York and Albany, 96; Washington, 94; Norrola, Va. 98; Montgomery, Ala, 98; Abilene, Tex., 96; Sr. Louis, 96; Chicago, 94; Along the Pacific coast the mercury ranged from 60 to 70, but at some points, like Hose-berry, thirty miles back from San Fran-cisco, the thermometer registered 100.

Terrible Conflagration in a New York Business Building.

THREE MEN KNOWN TO BE DEAD

Their Escape Cut Off by the Rapid Spread of the Fire, and Their Charred and Naked Bodies Afterward Found on a Eire Escape.

New York. Aug. 12.—At least three persons, and possibly others, were burned to death in a fire that destroyed a six-story brick building at No. 405 Greenwich street yesterday afternoon. Several persons were injured by the smoke and heat and by jumping, and two of them are expected t

jomping, and two of them are expected to die.

The dead are William Gray, foreman or electrical repair shops, and two unknown men, all of whom were caught on a fire escape and burned to death in view of the crowd. The injured who are expected to die are Felix Hass and an unknown man.

The ground floor of the building was occupied by A. K. Warren & Co., who operated the New York Electrical repair shops. The firm also occupied the fourth, fifth and sixth floors. The second floor was occupied by Julius Cohen as a distillery, and the third floor was occupied by Films & Bros., manufacturing jowelers. The building was completely burned out, and so was the one adjoining at No. 487. The first two floors of the latter building were occupied by Alexander Klinkowstein, a which finer. The third floor was vacant, the fourth floor was occupied by John Laney as the New York Pan company, and Kelbal & Co., cane manufacturers, occupied the fifth floor. The top floor was vacant. How the first started is not known, but its origin is attributed to an explosion. The total loss is \$180,000.

Fifty persons were at work in the machine shops of Waaren & Co., on the fifth floor of the building. Those who were first to reach the fire escapes succeeded to making their way down to the first floor landing, and from there jumped to the sidewalk. These who followed found that they were cut off by flames and dense smoke which poured out of the windows

below, and escaped over the roof. One of the first men to make for the first escape on the lifth floor was William Gray. He was seen on the landing for a moment, and was followed by another man, who was not recognized. Men on the roof shouted for him to take hold of a wire which they had let down, but they either did not hear them or were too frightened to do anything. Flames suddenly shot up and drove the man on the roof back, and they then lost sight of the men below. When it shifted the charred and naked bodies of the two men were seen on the fire escape.
