CYCLING CHAMPIONS.

Tem Cooper Wins Two More National Championships.

GARDINER WINS THE MILE OPEN.

He Succeeds in Making a New World's Record for That Great Event-Other Interesting Contests Under the Auspices of the League of American Wheelmen

LOUISVILLE, Aug. 15.—Tom Cooper yes terday won two more national champion ships, the quarter and the third mile. This makes three consecutive championship victories for the Detroit lad. He tried hard victories for the Detroit lad. He tried hard for the mile championship, but was beaten out by Little Tom Buffer, who made the race of his life. But Arthur Gardner, of the Morgan and Wright team, is the hero of the day. He rote a magnificent race in the one mile open, beating Sanger out by half a wheel's length in 2.011-5, world's record time, single paced. Sanger was unfortunate in this contest and deserves a great deal of credit for his work.

Great and interesting as were the championship events, the big race of the day

pionship events, the big race of the day was the last on the card, the principal one was inclusion the card, the principal one mile open. When the thirsten starters were lined up the pole was given to Bieker, with Sanger, Zeigler, Callahan, Bald, McParland, Gardiner, Eaton, Kennedy, Rigby, Tom Butler, Wells and Aher for company at bis right. Parsons and Johnson were put in to case. Par-Aher for company at his right. Parsons and Johnson were put in to pace, Parsons going one third, Johnson picking up and carrying a little over the other third. In the jump, Tom Butler and Callahan had a warm battle with Zeigler for the piace, Callahan securing it and Zeigler taking third back of Butler.

The men fell in behind in a long string, with Becker Konneck and Aber sand, with Becker Konneck and Aber sand.

with Becker, Kennedy and Akor sand-wiched in between the leading bunch, Sanger, Gardiner and Bald. In the second Sanger, Gardiner and Bald. In the second third Righy was killed by the pace and dropped out, leaving a big gap back of Becker, which Kennedy tried in vain to close. At the bell the chances of the men behind seemed hopeless, but Sanger made a glorious ride. Gardiner held to him throughout and Bald clung as close to Gardiner as he could. At the last turn Sanger swept around the four runnway sprinters like a quadand took the running into the stretch.

into the stretch.

Gardiner's factics had been observed by the growd, with whom the Chicago lad is a favorite, and a shout went up. The re-sult was foregone, for the curly haired Scotchman came out at Sanger's right with a killing sprint that carried him over the tape a winner by a length. Sanger got second and Tom Butler ran into third place, two lengths back. Bald, Zeigler and Becker came over almost abreast, just out of the money, while Callahan, Aker and McFarland survived the driv-Aker and McFarland survived the driv-ing finish. The quitters were Wells, Eaton, Kennedy and Rigby. The mile was ridden in 2.01 flat, a new world's sin-gle paced record, breaking the mark made by Bald at Buffalo a week ago, 2.01 4-5. The one-third mile national champion-ship was a sprint from start to finish, in which Capter department has ability

which Cooper damonstrated his ability and good judgment by making a show of a representative field of professionals rid-ing in a victor by half a length, after a tight brush with Owen Kimble and Bald. Cooper came in with an easy stride that showed his perfect condition, while Baid and Kimble were working like engines at his rear. At the tape Cooper had the advantage of half a length over Kimble, while the Buffalonian was eight inches back of the Louisville favorite. The hal-ance of the field came in well bunched back of Becker and Kennedy, who were a yard in Hald's rear. The time for the third was rather slow, 445-5, loss than that made in either of the trial heats of the morning

Twenty yards from the tape he dropped his head and dug for home with jump after jump, landing on the tape a clear length ahead of Callahan, who was trailing him. Kennedy lapped the latter's rear wheel, while Schrein slipped in and nipped Oldfield just as he reached home.

Tom Butler won the mile national championship in a beautiful sprint with a championship in a beautiful sprint with a full open length of daylight showing to the rear of his wheel. There were twelve starters, Johnson and Parsons pacing on singles. In the break little Zeigler went out with his familiar jump and landed square on the pacemaker's rear, while Butler and Callahan were fighting clear around the turn for his wheel. Butler got the better of the position, while Callahan, Cooper and Bald trailed him, and the balance of the field strung out in a long line hehind. First Kennedy and then Schrein

quit As the big field came into the stretch Zeigler swung out, giving the pole to But-ler, for whose wheel Willie Coburn made a quick and successful jump. From here on the race was clearly Butler's. As the tape was neared Callahan and Gardiner came up, killing off Dale and Cooper, and in the last half dozen jumps Callahan landed up at Coburn's side. Bald made one last drive and passed Ziegler and Gar-diner, taking fourth place. The mile was

ridden in 2 02 3-5. The mile tandem for professionals was a fine race, but the Butler brothers never lost their grip on it. The opposing team was H. C. Clark and J. Bowler.

In the work he had the assistance of Mrs. Bryan work he had the assistance of Mrs. Bryan Mr. and Mrs. Bryan left this norming for Irvington-on-the-Hudson, where they will remain until Monday next, as the guests of John Brislen Walker, editor of The Cosmo-politan. From Irvington they will proceed to Upper Reihook, where they will be entertained by Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Perrine for about a week. Mrs. Perrine was formerly Mrs. Bryan's school teacher. For a week or two longer Mr. Bryan will rest, except for the preparation of his letter of acceptance.
