Arrangements for the Reception of Li Hung Chang.

PRESIDENT WILL WILCOME HIM.

The Reception Ceremonies Will Probably Take Place on Board the United States Cruiser Dolphin, in New York Harbor, or in the Metropolis.

Washington, Aug. 18.—Arrangements are being completed as fast as possible for the reception of Li Hung Chang. There have been several delays in fixing the program, owing to the entire lack of infor-mation concerning his visit, the most important principal now in doubt being as to whether or not the Chinese vicercy is to be the guest of the United States. It is settled as far as it can be that the president will receive the distinguished guest in New York harbor, upon the Delphin or some other mayal resset, on Aug. 31. This program may be changed and later events

may render it impracticable.

The officials in Washington are not yet fully informed as to the wishes of the president in the matter. It is quite certain, however, that in case the president
