# FRAM'S SAFE RETURN.

Nansen's Arctic Steamer Now at Tromsoe, Norway.

CAPTAIN SVERDRUF MET ANDREE.

The Aeronaut Explorer Has Abandoned His Idea of Starting for the North Pole This Season, but Now Intends to Start in April Next.

CHRISTIANIA, Norway, Aug. 21.—Dr. Nansen's arctic exploring stammer Fram has arrived safely at Skjervee, & fishing port on the bay near the North cape. A dispatch from Skjervee to The Aftenposten magnith from Salaryor to the Antenpositor says that on Aug. 14 the Fram called at Danes Island, where a visit was made to M. Andree, the Swedish explorer, whose intention it is to attempt to find the North Pole by means of a balloon. M. Andree had not yet made his ascension. The Fram with demy Shienen, for Terrane water.

had not yet made his ascension. The Fram salled from Skjervoe for Tromsoe yester-day. All on board were well. Shortly after receiving the news of the arrival of the Fram at Skjervoe, and her Intention to sail from that place at once for Tromsoe, Dr. Nansen started for the latter place to meet her. Before leaving Indumerfest Nansen wired Captain Sver-drup, the commander of the Fram, as fol-lows: "A thousand welcomes to you all. Hurrah for the Fram." King Oscar has wired Captain Otto Neu-

mann Sverdrup expressing sontiments of the heartlest welcome and congratulating him on the honor won for Norway. There is great enthusiasm throughout the town, bunting being everywhere displayed, the decorations in the harbor being especially fine

A dispatch to The Aftenposten from A disputch to The Aftenposten from Skjervoe says that the Fram reached open water Aug. 13. A member of the expedi-tion expresses the opinion that the Fram would have penetrated much further into the Arctic regions, and that perhaps the North Pole would have been reached if the Fram had been frozen in east of the new Siberian islands. Fearing that the crush of the ice would wreck the ship, Captain Sverdrup and the crew were obliged, after Dr. Nansen left, to remove all the sledges, provisions, ammunition and light furniture.

Additional details received regarding the Fram are to the effect that the boat drifted from a point 85.50 degrees north. The greatest sea depth obtained by sounding was 2.185 fathems. The lowest temperature noted was 52 degrees below zero F. H. 

# A NEW MEXICO DELUGE

Cloudburst Suddenly Sweeps the Town of Mogollon.

A HUNDRED FAMILIES HOMELESS.

One Man Drowned in His Cabin and Another Swept Away to His Death-Narrow Escape of Mine Assayers-An Eight Foot Wall of Water.

MODOLLON, N. M., Aug. 21, --A tourible cloudburst struck this place on Wednes-day, leaving death and destruction behind. John Knight, a miner who resided at Soon Kingna, a miner who resided at Georgetown, was drowned in his cabin. Several others are reported missing, but so far only two bodies, those of Knight and an unknown Me loan, have been re-covered. These were found in a field about aix initise below. About a hundred families have been rendered homeless and thirty houses washed away.

The place is situated in a deep enzyon, between high mountains. The flood attained a height of over eight foot in the street, and insted over thirry minutes. Had it so continued ten min-utes longer the whole town would have been swept away.
