These terms were agreed upon and the Armonians surrendered and were conveyed on board Mr. Vincent's yacht Gulnare. The Gulnare was guarded all night by

London, Aug. 28.—A dispatch to The Daily News from Constantinople says that on Thursday it was estimated that from 5,000 to 4,000 persons had been killed in the riots in the different portions of the city. All Europeans en route for this city have been turned back by the cordons of troops occupying the public places, the wharves and bridges. The whole thing could be stopped in an hour if the govern-ment desired, but the members of the mob pretend to have received permission to loot, burn and destroy the Armenian quarters for a certain period of time. It is feared that there will be serious trontroops occupying the public places ble in the provinces.


