EARL LI AT WASHINGTON

The Chinese Statesman Received with Great Ceremony.

THE VICEROY AS AN INTERVIEWER.

He Thinks Passenger Agent Boyd of the Pennsylvania Railroad, is Underpaid.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4.—Li Hung Chang arrived at the national capital from Philadelphia last night.

Li inquired closely regarding the class of ships built at the Philadelphia yard, and then said: "I find that most of the nations build their ships in England and France. Why is it?"

Mr. Cramp's response was that there were various reasons for this condition.

At all of the stations along the route great crowds were gathered, the biggest crowds being at Wilmington and Baltimore.

On the arrival of the train in Washington Earl Li took his seat in a cushioned chair and four stalwart porters carried him to his carriage.

General Ruger took his place in the carriage with Li and the Chinese minister.

Inside the hotel General John W. Foster, Minister Yang Yu and the attaches from the legation and several gentlemen and ladies were assembled.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 4.—Li Hung Chang, the Chinese viceroy, paid a flying visit to this city yesterday and received a royal welcome.

From the station he was escorted in state to Independence Hall, where Mayor Warwick extended the formal welcome of the city and the ambassador made a felicitous response.

Li's wishes were consulted, and as he was fatigued from his journey, he preferred to go straightway to his apartments at the Hotel Walton.

The intention had been to show Li through the Baldwin Locomotive works and Cramps' shipyard, and elaborate arrangements had been made to that end.

On the trip to Independence Hall the viceroy occupied a carriage with Mayor Warwick, General Ruger and Interpreter Lo Feng Lou.

During his rest at the Hotel Walton he received a brief visit from Wharton Barker, and called upon Mr. and Mrs. John Russell Young, whose rooms were across the hall from his own suite.

During the morning and afternoon he received a number of callers, including the British minister, Sir Augustus Hemming, and the Italian minister, Admiral Betti.

SECRETARY FRANCIS IN CHARGE.

Hoke Smith's Successor Takes the Oath of Office.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4.—Ex-Governor Francis of Missouri, yesterday took the constitutional oath of office as secretary of the interior, succeeding Hoke Smith.

Mr. Francis went to the interior department last in the afternoon and received the various heads of bureaus, chief clerks and division chiefs.

"I have no policy formulated for the administration of the interior department," he said. "It is a work that involves many different questions that are intrinsic and important. I am not at all acquainted with the work here, and until I am familiar with the various duties that fall to me I shall not at any rate change existing policies."

Mrs. Francis and children arrived from Jamestown, R. I., yesterday afternoon. They will stay here only a few days, expecting to proceed to St. Louis, and will then rejoin the secretary and begin house-keeping here early in October.

Candidate Bryan's Pilgrimage.
