## A DEMOCRATIC SWEEP.

They Carry the Full State Ticket in Arkansas' Election.

THE MAJORITY 50,000 TO 60,000.

A Vigorous Contest in Little Rock Against the Issuance of Liquor Licenses Results in a Victory for the Liquor Men by a Small Majority.

LITTLE ROCK, Sept. 8.—General Daniel W. Jones, of Little Rock, was yesterday elected governor of Arkansas, and the entire Democratic state ticket has been successful at the polls. There were but two full tickets in the field, the Democratic and the Republican, the Populists contenting themselves with a candidate for governor. General Jones and Mr. Remmel, the Republican candidate, made an active canvass of the state, but Files, the Populist nominee, made no speeches.

The Democrats put forth special efforts to roll up a large majority in this election for its moral effect on the free silver cause in other states in November, and it is believed that Jones' majority will not be less than 50,000 over the combined opposition, and may reach 60,000. This is a Democratic gain of more than 35,000, as compared with the gubernatorial election two years ago, and the largest majority ever given in the state.

The state ticket elected is as follows: Governor, Daniel W. Jones; secretary of state, Alexander C. Hull; attorney general, E. B. Kinsworthy; auditor, Clay Sloan; treasurer, Harrison Galley; state land commissioner, J. F. Ritchie; superintendent of education, Juntas Jordan; commissioner of agriculture, W. G. Vincheller; chief justice, H. G. Hinn; associate justice, S. P. Hughes.

In Faulkner, Lafayette and other Populist and Republican strongholds the Democratic county tickets were elected by safe majorities. There was much scratching in Fulton county, and the probability is that the independent candidate for state senator in that district has carried the county against Hon. Jerry South, the regular Democratic nominee. The city of Helena gives the Democratic ticket a large majority, although Remmel, for governor, ran far ahead of the Republican ticket. In Lafayette county every Democrat is elected. The Democratic majority in Franklin is from 700 to 800.

The estimated Democratic majority in Miller county is 800, although one county officer is in doubt. Woodruff county is considered safe for the Democratic ticket. Many negroes scratched their ticket and voted for Jones for governor. Johnson county gives a large majority for the Democratic ticket. Jackson county elects the entire Democratic local ticket, and the county votes favorably on license. In Lonoke the Democratic ticket wins easily. White county is claimed for Jones by about 100. Sharpe county goes Democratic by 1,700 majority.

In Little Rock interest in the election centered on the liquor license question. Never before in the history of the city had there been such a campaign against license. The religious element, the W. C. T. U. and the ministers especially have been busily engaged for more than a month in an effort to vote no license, and were joined in the movement by the Republicans, who hoped in defeating license to break up the so-called Pulaski county Democratic ring.

Two big mass meetings were held by the Prohibition people on Sunday, and private meetings were held every hour in all the city churches. Returns indicate that license has carried by a small majority and that the regular Democratic ticket in this county has carried by about the usual majority.

It is known that some of the operators want to start their mines with imported labor. Both miners and operators are playing a waiting game.

## GAUDAUR THE CHAMPION

The Canadian Oarsman Defeats His Australian Opponent.

STANSBURY CLAIMED A FOUL.

This Was Disallowed by the Referee, However, and Gaudaur Finished an Easy Winner by Twenty Lengths, Covering the Four Miles in 33.01.

PITNEY, Sept. 8.—Jake Gaudaur, of Toronto, yesterday won the rowing championship of the world and \$2,500, in addition to the Sportsman's cup, defeating James H. Stansbury, of Australia, who recently defeated "Wag" Harding for the championship of the world.

The course was the usual championship course, four miles straightaway, from Putney to Mortlake.

After twelve false starts both men took the water together. Stansbury had a slight lead at Craven Steps, but soon afterwards Gaudaur pulled up, took the lead and maintained it to the Crab Tree, where Stansbury stopped and appealed to the referee, claiming a foul. The latter, however, would not allow the foul, and Gaudaur finished twenty lengths ahead in 33.01.

Stansbury, in an interview with a representative of the Associated Press, admitted that he was fairly beaten, though he added, he thought Gaudaur fouled him. He added, however, that was the umpire disallowed the protest, it's all right. The race was a hard one, but after I had claimed a foul I did not exert myself.

"Wag" Harding, recently defeated by Stansbury for the championship of the world, was one of the professionals present at the race, and he was interviewed on the subject by a representative of the Associated Press. Harding remarked: "There was no foul. I watched the race as closely as possible and I say they did not touch. Stansbury went all to pieces after passing Hammersmith bridge."

The general opinion expressed about the water side is that the race was a contest between a finished sculler and more brute force.

Gaudaur has held the professional championship of America since 1880 and twice before, 1883 and 1887, he held the same honors. Gaudaur and Stansbury have met before. The contest took place at the regatta at Austin, Tex., in 1883, when Stansbury was not in good form. Since that time Gaudaur has defeated Edward Haulon, George Buhner, Rogers, Hackett and other professionals at the Halifax regatta. He also stroked the "four" which beat Buhner's English combination.

**MANY ARRESTS IN CUBA.**  
General Weyler Has Another Scheme for "Ending the War Quickly."

HAVANA, Sept. 8.—The work of arresting people charged with conspiring against the government continues here. Last week the American colony was startled by the arrest of Mr. Samuel S. Tolon, a naturalized American and a prominent merchant of Curacao, who was captured on board the Ward line steamer Seneca as she was upon the point of sailing to the United States. On Sunday a magistrate, Senor Gonzales Llanusa, was taken into custody and placed in solitary confinement. The same day a prominent lawyer, Senor Alberto Zayas, a brother of the well known general of that name, was also placed in secret confinement, and yesterday the arrest announced of Senor Enrique Lama and Ignacio Lama, brothers; Senor Hernandez, an American, and Herr Habers Blank, a German, director of the Academy of Music here.

All the persons mentioned are detained uncommunicated; that is to say, they are not allowed to communicate with their friends or with counsel. Sooner or later, it is to be presumed, they will be shipped to some penal settlement, and that will be the last heard of them.

It is reported here that the captain general has formed a new plan of campaign which is certain to end the insurrection one way or the other. If rumor in this case turns out to be founded on fact some thirty Spanish steamers, loaded with troops, will arrive here before the end of this month, and an overpowering military force, or drug net, will be formed of all the troops available, stretching a line practically of armed men, backed by a second and a third reserve line, from north to south, and which will be drawn from one end of the island to the other, thus surrounding the insurgents and compelling them to fight a pitched battle.

**Speedy Cycling Across the Continent.**  
NEW YORK, Sept. 8.—The Examiner-Journal bicycle race from San Francisco to New York was finished at City Hall park at 3:25 yesterday afternoon, the entire race taking 13 days, 25 minutes and 44 seconds. The number of miles covered was 3,855. The last relay, from Kings Bridge to the finish, was run by Frederick J. Titus, the well known racing man, who wheeled his part in 25 minutes and 13 seconds. Four thousand persons were in City Hall park when Titus reached the end of the journey, and their cheers were deafening. Annie St. Toll and A. H. Ward went from the Battery to Governor's Island in a water bicycle today to deliver the message.

## MR. BRYAN HOME AGAIN.

He Addresses a Monster Meeting at Chicago in Route.

CHICAGO, Sept. 8.—The crowd gathered at Sharpshooters' park, the spot selected for yesterday's labor picnic, very slowly. At 1 o'clock there were probably not to exceed a thousand people around the speakers' stand. Many of them were ladies. After that hour there was a steady stream of people flowing into the grounds and the available places were soon occupied by an expectant throng.

At 2:30 o'clock a mighty shout went up from the outskirts of the crowd, and there was a great rush for the carriage occupied by Mr. Bryan, which had just then arrived within the enclosure of the park. Thousands of people pressed forward, seeking to shake Mr. Bryan by the hand, and the passing of the carriage through the crowd was somewhat slow in consequence. The densely packed crowds gathered there set up a roar that lasted for fully ten minutes. Then with a rush the gates were broken down. The police were utterly powerless to control the crowd, and in a short time the park was one dense mass of crushed but still cheering humanity. No one was seriously injured in the jam, though one or two women were removed in a fainting condition.

Mr. Bryan finally reached the speakers' stand, where he was received with prolonged applause. On the stand were seated Judge McConnell, Judge Prynitis and a large number of representatives of the trades unions of Chicago. At 2:30 Mr. Bryan began his speech, being introduced by Edward Carroll, president of the building trades council, in a brief and appropriate address. Mr. Bryan began by extolling the value of organized labor, and showed how great had been its benefits to toilers. His discourse soon took on a political aspect, and his points were enthusiastically applauded.

LEXINGTON, Neb., Sept. 8.—The Bryan party reached here at 10 o'clock this forenoon. At the depot a parade was formed and marched to the Bryan residence, a mile distant. The Silver party notification will occur at the state capital grounds this afternoon.

**Peel Bryan's Murderers Plot to Escape.**  
CINCINNATI, Sept. 8.—Jackson and Walling, the Peel Bryan murderers, are not hereafter to have the privileges which have heretofore been accorded them in the Covington jail. It has been found that through visitors and gifts of food a plan for escape had been made. Jackson was discovered in a whispered conversation with Walker, a colored burglar. Walker was dragged from his cell, and a new revolver was found in his pocket and a saw in his cell. Several saws were found in Walling's cell. Jackson's cell was searched, but nothing was found there.

**A Marvelous Grape Crop.**  
CLEVELAND, Sept. 7.—The grape growers of northern Ohio are afflicted with a big crop. The vines are black with fruit, which is selling at five cents a basket of ten pounds in the city. There is no profit in such a price for the basket costs two and a half cents and the packing as much more. It is said that no more grapes will be sent to market, but that the remainder of the crop will be sold to the wine makers. This year's crop is the heaviest ever known in this section of the country.
