



WARSAW, Ind., Sept. 9.- A frightful ac cident occurred last evening to a coaching party of young people which started out from this city. When about five miles north of this city the horses took fright at some object in the road. They backed the rear wheels of the tally-he over an embankment, and the people, horses and vehicle were rolled down a hillside in a mangled and bloody mass. Six persons were killed, as follows: James Fitzhne, Frank Metzler, Mary

Cumiffe, Francis Conn, Agnes Levst and Edward Smythe. The injured are James Holloway, fractured skull: May Morrell, broken ribs; Frank Donohue, driver, broken ribs; Victor Brice, broken leg.

The remainder of the party escaped with more or less painful bruises. One of the horses was killed in the fail, and the others had to be shot. There was a heartrending scene as the

survivors extricated themselves from the wreok of the coach and went groping about in the darkness in a search for their friends. The bodies of the dead were ten-derly earried to the top of the embank-ment and laid by the roadside, while the injured were taken to a neighboring farm house and physicings quickly summond.
