MANY CASUALTIES REPORTED.

The greatest damage was done at the Palais de Justice All the windows on the Rue de Harlay were smadded, part of the roof was blown away and the corri-ders were filled with clouds of dust and branches of trees. The sittings of the court had to be suspended. The number of minor casualities and in-juries to persons is large, and further re-ports are constantly being received. Over fifty injured have thus far been reported to one fire station alone, and five hadly in-jurged were brought in Several men and we men had thair skulls fractured by the fall-ing of some gates behind which they had ing of some gates whind which they had sought shelper from the storm. A cab driver who had taken refuge in his cab was killed and the cab denoilshed. His horses were also killed. Nine nembers of the staff of La France, who were leaving the Tribunal da Coanarcse when this storm suddenly broke, were all soriously injured, one having his skull fractured. At least a dozon persons were carried holdly into the Seine from the bridges and quays, and were rescued with great diffi-quays, and were rescued with great diffi-entity, several being injured and left in a oritical condition, so that they had to be taken to the hospitals. The breaking of the storm was accom-

The breaking of the storm was accom-panied by many demonstrations of fright by individuals and crowds, the panie of one spreading to others, the lowering sky and the howling of the tempest, filling the air with flying debris, frightening the crowds in the streets out of self control. Everybody started to run, without much regard to obstacles, personal or otherwise, that might come in their way, and there was shouring and screaming to add to the nonfusion.

The damage to property was widespread and serious. The first tempest of wind, which did most of the damage, was immediately succeeded by torrents of rain, and

cellars all over Paris are flooded. At Clichy, the roadyay of the Boule vard National, sudsided several yards as a result of the washing away of the readbed. The Qual des Orfevres shows a striking scene of desolution, buildings being dam-aged, things overturned, and all looking as though swept by a torrent of rushing

water. From the Qual St. Michael to beyond the Pont Nuef every free was uprooted, many barges were sunk and a number of small heats were swamped. The crews of the barges, however, succeeded in escap-ing. One of the haundry beats of the Scine, where thirty laundresses were at work, was sunk, and the women were saved with

the greatest differing. The scaffolding of the court yard of the same Chapelle was blown away and every pane of ginss in the side of the palace of justice, facing the river, was smashed by uprooted trees, etc.

All the omnibuses struck by the cyclone were upset and their passengers more or less injured.

The cyclone lasted only about a minute, but in addition to the damage already inentioned considerable destruction was caused on and about the Pont Nucl, the Place du Chatelet, the Observatoire, the Tour St. Jacque and elsewhere in the neighborhood.

Numerous newspaper klosks were over-turned and the inmates injured. The roof of the Opera Comique was blown in. The Ambigu-Comique and the Folles Dramatiques theaters were both damaged. Twenty-nine horses were killed. Eight beer houses were wreeked.

A large ward in the Hotel Dien is full of the victims, two of whom died last HON. ELIAS DAVIS night, and several there and in the other hospitals are in a precarious condition. 
