MARCHING ON DONGOLA.

The Dervishes Are Gathering in Force to Meet the Troops.

RAPID ADVANCE UP THE NILE.

After Months of Struggling with Terrific Heat the Expedition Is Now in Full Swing-The Troops Full of Enthusiasm.

Cairo, Egypt, Sept. E.—The reports re-ceived from Kosheh yesterday chronicle the arrival there by train of the remainder of the Staffordshire regiment, the first de-tachment of which arrived Thursday. The strday, Sir Herbert Kitchener, and his staff will street from Kosheh today a

his staff will start from Kosheh today, a portion of the Staffordshire regiment ac-companying him.

The news received at Kosheh from the front is that the dervish outpost at Kermua, just above the third enternet of the Nile, is being reinforced by their mounted troops, while the region being the Egyp-tian and dervish outposts is fast becom-ing deserted. It is expected that the dervishes will attempt to make a stand at Kormma, and the first fighting of the ad-vance to Dongola is looked for at that

vance to Dongola is looked for at that point. A rapid advance to Dongola is now believed to be in order with a view to striking a prompt and effective blow to the power of the khalifa.

The Third brigade has reached Absarrat safely, and the main body of cavalry is arriving there. The cavalry and scouts report the dervishes still in view suth of Duglo, but the energy patrons at the Duglo, but the enemy retreats at the slightest sign of a forward movement. rightest sign of a forward movement. The Anglo-Egyptian scouts, feeling the way for the advance guard, are steadily pushing on to Kasbar, fourteen miles further south, which will be the next place occupied. The troops, black and white, are full of enthusiasm and anxious for a bank with the control of the state of the control brush with the enemy. The weather is hot in the extreme, but the soldiers are benefiting from being on the move. Al-the troops taking part in the expedition are now on the march towards Dongola.

The intelligence department reports the dervishes gathering in force north of Dongola. Clashes between the dervishes and the Anglo-Egyptian scorts are expected at any moment. Thus the sevence of the British-Egyptian expedition up the River Nile, with Dongola, if not Khartoum. as its objective point, is now in full swing, after months of struggling with terrilo heat and cholera.
