## NEW YORK DEMOCRATS.

The Buffalo Convention Will Indorse the Chicago Platform. .

SENATOR HILL WILL NOT BE THERE.

Tammany Will Attend with Five Special Trains-A Second Ticket, Headed by a Gold Democrat, Probable-Ex-Lieutenant Governor Sheeban's Position.

BUFFALO, Sept. 14.—All within forty-eight hours the prospect of a state Demo-eratic convention, culivened by a sharp contest for supremacy between those who advocate strict party regularity by the indersement of the Chicago ticket and platform, and those who are inclined to believe that what they called herestes are not binding upon the party, has vanished and in its place has appeared a brass band, red fire, ratification meeting with little or

Senator Hill will probably not attend the convention. That will remove one element of anticipated discord. "I will probably remain away from the convention. The statement cinariating from Buffalo that I had telegraphed in response to a query that I would be there Tuesday, is without foundation. Mr. Mack, the state committeeman from that section, telegraphed me on Friday asking me when I would arrive in Buffalo and me when I would arrive in Buffale and whether it was definite or not whether I would be there - I have not answered the telegram. Serious Condition of Affairs in the Ottoman Empire.

VICTIMS OF RIOTS NUMBER 8,000.

So Called Precautionary Measures Have Not Improved the Situation, but Have Eather Served to Extend the Feeling of Terrorism-The Sultan's Delusion.

But the troops are at the same time instructed that they are authorized to use their arms in self defense if they are attacked. Meantime the British relief committee is busy with the work of holping the distressed Armenians.
