THE EXTRADITION OF TYNAN.

The Irish Landers in London and Dublin Regard the Arrests of the Alleged Dynamite Plotters with Consternation-Irish National Alliance Takes No Action.

LONDON, Sept. 16.-More attention is be-ing paid to the details of the alleged dynamite conspiracy than any other subject, not excepting the situation in Turkey. Those who do not participate in the hor-ror professed by the anthorities over the diabolical details of the plot which they are claiming with sensational impressive-ness to have uncarthed, find sufficient entertainment in the expressions of their cepticism.

A representative of the Associated Press was stated there that the work had been done in the United States by the Pinkerton agency, who had for years forwarded every week the fullest reports of every meeting of any revolutionary body in the United States, especially in Chicago and New York. The espionage maintained on gatherings in those two cities is re-markably complete. There is a full file in Scotland Yard of all resolutions, documents, etc., pertaining to the gatherings and full descriptions of the members and their actions.

It is a notable fact that the police au-thorities of Paris express great scorn for the idea that there was any connection between any plot that Tynan may have o cocted and an attempt upon the life of the czur. The elaborate tale of collusion be-tween the Fenians and continental anarchists and Russian nihilists is laughed archists and Russian minists is induced at in Paris. The suspicion is broadly hinted at that the story of Tynan being implicated in a plot against the person of the cars was concected for no other purpose than to appeal to the political sym-pathy of France towards Russia to effect a consent to the extradition of Tynan.

It is perfectly evident that Scotland Vard itself shares the French view of the alleged Fontan-nihilist combination, as there has been no change in the preparations airs made to guard the car upon his forth-coming visit to London. The preparations are the same as those usually made upon the visit of any foreign sovereign to Lon-don. There is no stock taken at Scotland Yard in the idea that Tynan meant to blow up Marlborough House while the Prince of Wales and the czar were within The Irish leaders in London and Dublin regard the arrests of the alleged dynamite plotters with consternation. A project has been on foot ever since the adjourn-ment of parliament to obtain the release of all the Irish political prisoners—a pro-ject which was encouraged by the recent action of the government in releasing from Portland prison Dr. Thomas Galla-gher, Albert G. Whitehead, John Daly and Thomas Deveny. It was intended to inaugurate a great demonstration in be-JOSEPH WYATT, half of the prisoners and an agitation in the press, followed by a fleree attack in the house of commons in January. The disclosures in connection with the arrests are considered unfavorable to the success

of this plan. The Dublin Independent says: "The so-called plot is more like a plot against Iroland. The release of some of the Irish political prisoners accused of dynamite offenses had no scorer called forth some protests in England than these sensational arrests in connection with a new plot are announced. We emphatically protest against the deliberate effort being made to turn this plot against Ireland and the unfortunates now in prison." The Associated Press has received a dis-

patch from Houlogne-Sur-Mer which says that Tynan was taken before the public prosecutor there yesterday afternoon, and was interrogated as to his antecedents and as to the minders of Thomas Henry Burke and Lord Frederick Cavendish in Phonix Park, Dublin, in 1882. Tynan in reply denied that he took any actual part in the murders. Subsequent to the examination several Scotland Yard men had an interview with the public prosecutor, who sig-nified to them his approval of the active consures taken by the English police to soure Tynan and his associates.





I mean by this that the alliance as an organization has taken no steps in the matter whatever, and further, we have no official or unoffiand news concerning the arrest of Tynan, Kenney and the others. I may say, how-ever, that a fund will undoubtedly be raised to defend the men and prevent their extradition to England. Inshmen all over will subscribe to such a fund."


