

TAMMANY TO ACT AS A UNIT.

BUFFALO, Sept. 17. - The platform of the Democratic party in New York state as drafted today has as its first propo-sition this statement: "The Democrats of the state of New York in convention as-sembled do hereby unreservedly indorso and approve the platform adopted by the national convention at Chicago, and we hereby unanimously approve the nominees of said convention, William Jonnings Bryan and Arthur Sewall, and pledge them our carnest and cordial support."

The convention was not called to order

SHE STRIKES A ROCK.

The Battleship Texas Hard and Fast in Newport Harbor.

FUTILE ATTEMPTS TO GET HER OFF

NEWPORT, R. L. Sept. 17—The battle-ship Texas, which left the North Atlantic squadron yesterday for the purpose of getting a supply of torpedoes here, struck a rock while coming into the harbor at 5.50 c clock and is hard and fast. The first warning the officers had of the danger was a slight shock just forward of danger was a slight shock just forward of midships. Captain Glass at once ordered the port anchor out. Captain Henry Glass and Lioutenant D. J. Kelly were both on the bridge and neither supposed the water at that point to be so shallow. The tug Aquidnock arrived alongside

the Texas within half an hour after she struck and quickly got a line out. The ship however, proved too heavy for the tug to handle, and was apparently firmly fixed on the rock. sist her Captain Glass when seen refused to be interviewed. He gave orders to let no one come aboard the vessel. The department at Washington has been notified of the accident. The Texas is a second class two turret battleship of 6,315 tons displace-ment and 8,000 horse power. Her speed is seventeen knots an hour. She was built

in 1883-90 and cost 82,500,000.

There is great regret in naval circles over the accident to the Texas. The vessel has had an unfortunate carrier, and on more than one occasion has had to be laid up for repairs. Once at Norfolk her entire built was resourced. Captain Glass. hull was reconstructed. Captain Glass, commander of the Texas, has been particularly unfortunate. Two years ago, when in command of the Cincinnati, the essel struck "Execution" rock, outside of Hell Gate.

A statement was given out late last night by the commander of the Texas. During the evening a diver was sent down and he says that the rocks in the vicinity do not press against the vessel. He re-ported that she rested on a sandy ridge, and is in no danger while the water was
