

General Harrison Delivers Ten Addresses Speaking at Evansville at Night.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Oct. 21. - General Harrison arrived at Evansville at 6 o'clock Harrison arrived at Evansville at 6 o clock last evening, having made ten speeches during the day. Everywhere thore were great crowds and everywhere great interest was manifested. 
