# FATAL DISOBEDIENCE.

It Results in a Fatal Railroad Wreck Near St. Louis.

EIGHT KILLED, TWENTY-ONE HURT

An Excursion Train Carrying Union Veterans and Their Families to the Dedication of a Soldiers' Home Crashed Into an Accommodation Train.

St. Louis, Oct. 26.—Shortly before 10 o'clock yesterday morning, two passenger trains on the St. Louis and San Francisco road collided nearly opposite Windsor station, about thirteen miles from this city, instantly killing eight persons and injuring more than twenty, three of whom will probably die. The killed are all of St. Louis. Their names are: Adolph Hohl, engineer of the accommodation train; Barney McKenna, in charge of the refreshments; Maud McKenna, aged 14, his daughter; Charles Molina, Conrad Kuntz, C. C. Blovin, H. T. Hall and John Cartwright.

The injured are: Ferdinand Lange, internal injuries; David Garrett, internal injuries, head cut and leg bruised; J. E. Riblet, hips and legs injured; Charles R. Milets, scalp wounds; Frank Hasler, fireman on excursion train, spinal cord injured and hurt internally; Mrs. J. B. McDaniel, slightly injured; George Atwood, conductor on suburban train, slightly injured; Peter Hill, face cut and badly bruised; George Wolf of Kirkwood, conductor on excursion train, hips injured and body bruised; Robert Mulholland of Spring Park, brakeman on suburban train, slightly injured; Joseph A. Driden of Springfield, Mo., engineer excursion train, skull fractured and badly scalded; Frederick Miller of Valley Park, fireman on suburban train, legs injured and body bruised; A. K. Smith of Valley Park, baggageman on suburban train, head cut and hand and arm injured; Mrs. A. K. Smith of Valley Park, injured by shock; Matt Wappler of Valley Park, slightly injured; Robert Langen, William Sultzer, Henry Darborg, Louis Hunt, Henry McMichael and Mrs. Rose Hill were more or less injured. All reside in St. Louis except where otherwise noted.

The collision occurred between the second section of an excursion train bound west and the Pelesco Valley Park accommodation east bound. From what can be learned at this hour the accident was the result of disobedience or neglect of orders on the part of the excursion train crew, who should have remained at Spring Park for orders and let the accommodation through.

The excursion train was the second section of a special bound for St. James, Mo., 100 miles west of St. Louis, where it was to be decoupled yesterday under the auspices of the G. A. R. and Woman's Relief corps. The first section had gone through safely, and the second, which consisted of eleven coaches heavily laden with G. A. R. men, their wives and children, left St. Louis about 9 o'clock. According to J. D. Dishman, the telegraph operator and station agent at Spring Park, it should have stopped at that place. Instead of doing so the second section passed by the station and soon after met the accommodation coming down grade at full speed.

Engineer Hohl, of the accommodation, was not aware that the second section was on the road, and in trying to make the switch at Kirkwood crashed into the ill-fated train in a cut. There was only one car, a combination baggage and coach, on Engineer Hohl's train, but the collision was terrific, both engines being demolished and a number of the cars telescoped. The wreckage was piled high on the track, and above the sound of escaping steam could be heard the cries of the frightened and injured passengers.

Next to the engine of the excursion train was the commissary car, filled with refreshments. Barney McKenna was in charge of the edibles, and with him was his 14-year-old daughter Maud. Both were instantly killed, being scalded and crushed. A number of passengers, mostly young men, were grouped around the temporary counter, eating and drinking. Almost all were either killed or injured. This and the next car, in which were seventy passengers, suffered the worst damage, and most of the killed and injured were taken from them. Engineer Hohl, of the accommodation, which was running on time, was killed and his fireman, Frank Hasler, wounded.

# THE COMING ELECTION.

Fusion Between the Silver Forces in the Several States.

REPUBLICANS FUSE IN TEXAS.

In All Other States That Party Has a Straight Electoral Ticket, While the Democrats Have Straight Electoral Tickets in Only Fifteen States.

CHICAGO, Oct. 26.—The Republicans have a straight electoral ticket in forty-four of the forty-five states, having effected a fusion in only one—Texas, with the "middle of the road" Populists and gold Democrats.

The Democrats have a straight electoral ticket in only fifteen of the states, having effected a fusion with the Populists and silver Republicans in twenty-nine of the others, a conclusion not having yet been reached in the remaining ones. In some cases the Populists and silver Republicans endorsed the Democratic electoral ticket, but in others concessions of electors were made to them for their support of Bryan and Sewall. In two states, Oregon and South Dakota, the Democrats have endorsed the Populist electoral ticket.

The following table shows the states with a straight Democratic electoral ticket and those in which a division of electors has been made. The figures for North Carolina are those embraced in the proposition of the Populists to the Democrats, who, however, have not yet accepted their offer of division in that state, but the Populists, it is understood, still have hopes of effecting a fusion in North Carolina:
