The Alleged Victim of Rightraymen May Have Killed His Wife.

Nonusciowa, Pa., Oct. 20 — Although no warrant for his arrest has been issued. Charles O. Kalser is detained at police headquarters on suspidion of having mushered his young wife. After the tragedy Kalser, behaved as though he had lost all recollection of his wife's death, feigning to believe that he regarded her as unconscious and was impatiently awaiting intelligence of her condition. He played to perfection the role of a person crazed by grief and anxiety, and for a dual purpose he was put under the influence of opiates. While he was sleeping soundly Captain Rodenbaugh and Coroner Kurtz were recovering the alleged stolen articles, making a discovery that completely breaks down Kaiser's story of robbery by highwaymen.

Kaiser and his wife carried a joint insarrance of \$10,000 on their lives, the policies being so written that the death of either would make the other beneficiary, Kaiser is 34 years old, and his wife was a year younger.

DEADLY CYCLONES.

Judge Frank Ives, of District Court of Louisiana, Mississippi and Oklahoma Devastated.

SEVERAL DEATHS IN OKLAHOMA.

Buildings Lifted Into the Air and Smashed Into Splinters-Destructive Work of the Wind in Tensas Parish, La .- A Mississippi Candidate Blown Away.

GUTHRIE, O. T., Oct. 30.-A cyclone swept over a stretch of country about twenty miles east of here at 7.30 o'clock Wednesday night, devastating a distance Wednesday night, devastating a distance several miles long and probably a hundred yards wide. The farm house of William Toby was first in the path of the storm. The building was destroyed and Mr. Toby was probably fatally injured. The other members of his family escaped. Half a mile further north the Mitchell postellice and store was lifted bodily into the air, carried a hundred yards and dashed to the earth. The building was smashed into splinters, and Postmaster M. T. Mullin and his wife, who lived in the building, were killed. Their bedies were found yasterday morning. They died clasped in each other's arms. Two steleks were deviven into Mr. Mullin's skull, but there was not a scratch on the body of his there was not a scratch on the body of his

The farm house of Abner Jones was also The farm house of Abner Jones was also wrecked and many smaller buildings were destroyed, frees uprooted and crops rulned. Rumors were current that the same storm did frightful damage further east in Payne county, and that several persons were killed there, but up to a late hour no particulars are obtainable. At nine No. 12, near Krebs, it is reported that five people were killed.

In Lincoln county Mr. and Mrs. John McLaughlin have been found dead in the ruins of their home, and Harrison Jones will die of his injuries.


