After a Brief Rest at Cleveland He Will Return to Canton to Prepare for the Work of His Great Office-Mr. Bryan's Manifesto.

CANTON, O., Nov. 7 -- President-elect McKinley's afternoon outing yesterday in-cluded a drive to West Lawn cometery. Returning home he found a special car load party of distinguished Cincinnatians.

### MR. BRYAN'S MANIFESTO.

The Defeated Candidate Holds Out Hope

for the Future.

Lincoln, Neb., Nov. 7.—Mr. Bryan has replied to some of the offers of employment at high salaries which he has received since election day, declining on the ground that he desires to be free to devote a large portion of his time in the future to the advocacy of bimetallism. He has agreed to address a public meeting in Denver at an early day, but beyond this has made no engagements for the immediate future.

Mr. Bryan yesterday gave out an ad-dress to the bimetallists of the United

States, in which he says:
"The friends of bimetallism have not been vanquished, they have simply been overcome. They believe that the gold standard is a conspiracy of the money changers against the welfare of the human race and until convinced of their error they will continue the warfare against it."
Mr. Bryan holds out hope for the future, saving that "bimetallism has almost triumphed in its first great fight," and pro-

coeds "No personal or political friend need grieve because of my defeat. My ambition has been to secure immediate legislation rather than to enjoy the honors of office. Therefore, defeat brings to me no feeling of personal loss. Speaking for the wite, who has shared my labors, as well as for

myself, I desire to say that we have been amply repaid for all that we have done. "In the love of millions of our fellow "In the love of millions of our fellow citizens, so kindly expressed in knowledge gained by personal contact with the people, and in broadened sympathies, we find full compensation for whatever efforts we have put forth.
