# THE SULTAN'S PLEDGES.

Frightened Into Promises of Sweeping Reforms.

THE FRENCH WERE DETERMINED.

The Turkish Ruler Fears the Wrath of European Powers, and Presents a List of Proposed Reforms to M. Hanetaux, French Minister of Foreign Affairs,

PARIS, Nov. 9.-When the sulfan received an account of the recent speech de-livered by M. Hanotaux, minister of forlivered by M. Hanotaux, minister of for-eign affairs, in the chamber of deputies, Nov. 3, upon the Armentan question, he sent his secretary to M. Jutes Cambon, the French ambassador to Turkey, to inquire concerning the matter. In his speech be-fore the chamber M. Hanotaux declared that the excesses of the Ottoman govern-ment had furnished legitimate motives for compilaint. He also stated that a convert complaint. He also stated that a concert had been established among the powers, and that in October, 1888, an understand-ing had been reached with the porter to the effect that the latter should grant reforma-

M. Hanotaux announced that, owing to the anarchy which reigned in the adminthe amerchy which reigned in the admin-istrative spheres of Turkey, troubles had ensued, and France was bound to use language the strength and significance of which Turkey must understant. The powers, M. Hanotsux said, were convinced of the necessity of their solid union, but there must be no isolated action and no interference with the integrity of the Otto-man samples.

In conclusion the minister of foreign affairs announced that during the czar's visit a precise exchange of views had socurred, and that a united Europe would be able to show the sultan that he must give his subjects security and peace. When the representative of the sultan conferred with M. Cambon, at Pera, he was informed by the French ambassador to Turkey that under instructions it was stated that it was imperative that the sultan must adopt a certain number of measures calculated to reassure the public and give Europe satisfaction. The Turkish envoy to Paris, Manir Bey, has now informed M. Hanotaux that the sultan upon the receipt of M. Cambon's nessage immediately decided to adopt the following measures:

The liberation from the prisons of the Ottoman empire of all persons against whom no charges have been preferred.

The issuance to the police of orders that all peaceable Armenians must not be peasesonted. In conclusion the minister of foreign

It is also announced that Maxhar Hey, who was accused of being responsible for the murder of Father Salvator, would be tried by court martial. NEW YORK, Nov. 8.-The Morning Ad-New York, Nov. a.—The Morning Advertiser says today: It was reported in this citr resterday that the or-consulgeneral to Havain, Hamon O. Williams, might be expected here from Europe in about to days. Although the fact of Mr. Williams' presence in Spain escaped the vigilance of the newspaper correspondents in the Spanish capital, it is nevertheless true that he has been in Madrid for three weeks past, and in the immediate circle of his family it was amounced that he was to leave for New York by one that he was to leave for New York by one of the North German liners on Saturday

While the fact cannot, for obvious reasons, be definitely learned, it is generally believed by his personal friends that Mr. Williams' visit to Madrid has been made

Williams' visit to Madrid has been made as an agent of the United States, with the view of making some arrangement by which a peaceable solution of the Cuban question might be brought about.

It will be remembered that or returning from Havana Mr. Williams spent some time in Washington, where he had several lengthy interviews with President Clevelanti and Secretaries Obey and Herbert. He left then for Europe, satting on Sopt. 8, it being generally supposen that his trip was taken for rear and in the interest of his health.
