

IT DISPLEASES THE GERMANS.

An Officially Approved Newspaper Article Declares That "Germany Will Never Tolerate Foreign Intervention with Her Interests in South and Central America."

LONDON, Nov. 14.—The Chronicle this morning publishes a summary of the agree-ment of the settlement of the Venezuelan boundary dispute between the United States and England, adding merely: "This momentous news reaches us too late for editorial comment."

The agreement, as published by The Chronicle, is very short, covering only two pages of printed matter, as given out, and

"Heads of the proposed agreement be-tween Venezuela and Great Britain for the settlement of the Venezuelan bound-ary questions, as agreed upon between Great Britain and the United States." There are four separate heads to the

The first head provides for the appointment of an arbitration tribunal to deter-mine the boundary between Venezuela

and British Guiana.

The second head provides for the appointment of a tribunal, consisting of two to be nominated by the justices of the supreme court of the United States, two to be nominated by the British supreme court and the fifth, a jurist, to be selected by the other four.

The third head of the agreement directs that the tribunal shall investigate all the facts necessary to decide the controversy as to the extent of territory known to belong respectively to the United Netherlands and to Spain at the date Great Britain acquired Guiana.

The fourth head provides that the arbiters shall ascertain all the facts necessary to arrive at a proper decision, and shall be governed in their findings by three short rules, the most important of which provides that actual holdings or a prescription of fifty years shall make good

Britain and Venezuela. In fact it will be a treaty in Itself, only requiring clauses to be added relating to the proceedure, the compensation of members of the tribunal and other minor routine matters. The Chronicle has a dispatch from Washington which says that Mr. Olney has urged Senor Andrade, the Venezue-

lan minister there, to go to Caracas to get President Crespo and the Venezuelan congress to accept the agreement. This dis-patch also says that Mr. Oluey advised the resumption of diplomatic relations with Great Britain by Venezuela.

"We wish to take the first opportunity to declare," adds this officially approved article, "that the precedent is only English, and in no way European. Germany, at least, will never tolerate the intervention of a foreign state in the protection of German interests in South and Central



THE HARDSHIPS OF THE CREW.

For Over a Week They Have Been Fighting for Life Against Cald and Hunger in the Bleak, Desolute Wilds of the Cana-

SAULT STE. MARIE, Mich., Nov. 14.—The Camadian steamer Acadia, which has been missing for several days, is ashore on the rocks near Michiplesten river, and will be a total loss. The master of the steamer Captain Clifford, with four of the crew reached port last night in a sailboat be-longing to the lighthouse department. Since a week ago Thursday they have been fighting for life against cold and hunger in the bleak, desolate wilds on the Can-adian shore of Lake Superior. The Acadia manufaces 800 tons, and is owned in Ham-liton. Ont. Her cargo was 20,000 bushels of wheat, the boat clearing from Fort William last Wednesday for Kingston. "We were headed for shelter at Michipi-

coten river when a heavy snow storm set in and at to o'clock. Thursday night we struck the rocks," said Captain Clifford.
"The sea increased and soon after mid-night we were compelled to abandon the (steamer. Our crow of seventeen men took steamer. Our crow of seventeen men took a supply of provisions and bedding ashore in the boats. We constructed a rule shelter on the beach near the steamer and remained there two days. The weather was very cold and all hands suffered. There was no habitation within many miles, and the country was very rough and weekled. The measurement of the research of the resea worded. The weather moderated after two days, and leaving two men to watch the steamer, the remaining fifteen got into the two yawl boats and started out for the

The boats were well laden with men and provisions. We arrived at Garganian Saturday night. Leaving emorgh provisions, four of its embarked in the lighthouse tender, a sallboat, Sunday morning to make a desperate attempt to reach Sault Ste. Marie. But we struck heavy weather, and near Mamainco we were forced to land again. The decelate character of the country continued and our provisions ran low. Fortunately a settle-(0 ment was discovered and we obtained

food.

The weather moderated vesterday. morning, and we reached port in the af-ternoon all right. I am afraid that the men left at Gargantua will suffer from hunger if we are not enabled to reach them in a short time. There are twelve them only two days longer.

Captain Chamberlain and the members of his erew will leave this aftermon if the weather permits for the scene of the week. On the way he will pick up the men at Gargantin. An effort will be made to rescue the steamer if anything can be done for her, but it is more than likely that she will be a total week.
