In insurgent circles it is said that their leaders claim that the return of the capabout an engagement with Macon is equivalent to a defeat of the Spanish forces, for the latter have completely failed to carry out the program nupped out by the Spanish commander. It is as-serted that the plan of Antonio Macco was to avoid a general engagement with the Spanish troops, as he feels confident that the wearlsome campaign being conducted by the Cubans must ultimately exhaust the Spaniards.

General Lee Doubts a Rumor.

Washington, Nov. 25.—Consul General Lee was at the state department again yesterday. When asked as to the report that the Competitor prisoners had been tried at Moro Castle, contrary to a protest made by him before he left Havann, General Lee said: "I don't believe any trial has occurred. If it had the facts would be speedily reported here by Vice Consul Springer.

Another Defeat for Spain. LONDON, Nov. 25.—A Singapore dispatch to The Times says that the Spaniards have been defeated by the insurgents in the Philippines with the loss of 300 of them.

SHERMAN AND HANNA

Complications in the Reported Political Deal Between Them.

CLEVELAND, Nov. 25.—Concerning the positions which Senator Sherman and M. A. Hanna will fill under the forthcoming national administration a gentleman who is as much in the confidence of McKinley and Hanna as any one said to a represen-tative of the Associated Press: "It is desired that. Senator Sherman re-

sign and accept the secretaryship of state, and that Mr. Hanna go in his place to the senate. There are obstacles to this plan Senator Sherman is an old man, and may not wish to relinquish a place in which he is entirely contented to accept the great responsibilities and hard work of the secretaryship of state. Again Governor Bush-nell would have to appoint his successor, and every one knows that it is his ambition to be elected by the next Ohio legis-lature a year from now to sit in the senate. Yet if he does not want to appoint Mr. Hanna what can he do? He cannot appoint himself. Foraker is already there and Grosvenor is an ardent McKinley

"If President-elect McKinley says to Sherman that the prosperity of the country requires that his hand be at the helm in the state department I don't think he can refuse. Then if McKinley, the Republican president, and Sherman, the Ohio senator and veteran statesman, say to Bushnell, the Republican governor, that the services of Hanna in the senate are necessary to carry out the Republican party's promise of a presperous administration, how can be refuse! This much is sure. Senator Sherman will not resign until he is assured that the plan will be carried out."

Ex-Priest Stattery Again in Trouble. NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 25.—It took all the police reserves of this city last night to save Slattery, the ex-priest, from being mobbed. He lectured in this city, and at the close a crowd of 1,500 gathered as the doors to wait for his appearance on the street. Slattery and his wife waited in the church until the crowd began to disperse. A guard of policemen then escorted the couple to a cab in waiting, the cabman lashed his horse and broke a way through the mob. Slattery and his wife had just got safely aboard a train bound for New York when the crowd began to pour into the railroad station. It was impossible then to do the ex-priest any harm, as almost immediately the train steamed away.

Death of New Brunswick's Governor. St. Johns, N. B., Nov. 95.-A cable from Genoa, Italy, announces the death there at o'clock last night of Governor Fraser, of New Brunswick. Governor Fraser, after obtaining six months' leave of absence left here on the first of the month. Do ceased was one of the best known public men in New Brunswick, being at one time attorney general of the province and later supreme court judge. He was appointed governor three years ago.

Sixteen Dead in a Prairie Fire. GUTHRIE, O. T., Nov. 25.—A disastrons prairie fire swept over the Seminole country yesterday near Rochelle. Sixteen persons, it is reported, were burned to death by the raging flames. A Catholic mission was saved by the heroic work of Sisters Freda and Kirk. These two sisters fought the flames for two hours with blankets, and saved the lives of twenty Indian pupils.

Minister Murdered and Robbed. BLOOMINGTON, Ills , Nov. 25 — Hev. James Miller, paster of Grace M. E. church, of Bloomington, was found murdered and rothed lu an alley at Decatur, III. 
