HONORING CIRCJEDA.

Celebrating the Death of Cuban Leader Maceo.

THE FEAST OF PUNTA BRAVA.

A Correspondent of the Associated Press Visits the Place Where the Insurgent General Met His Death-Rut Friends of Cuba Still Believe Him Alive.

Havana, Dec. 21.—The correspondent of the Associated Press left Havana at an early hour yesterday morning by rail for Maraino, and thence by coach to attend Maraino, and thence by coach to attend the grand feast tendered to Major Ciru-jeda, at Punta Brava, in honor of his part in the killing of Macco. It was like a summer day, and the road was lined with troops the entire distance to protect the ersons attending the feast from the city. Before the feast there was a grand

pageant, which was witnessed with great pagasat, which was withoused with great enthusiasm. The least was inaugurated with a military mass. Major Cirujeda's column and the guerilla forces under Pearl, which fought at Punta Brava when Macco was killed, being the participants nd the chaplain of the San Quintin bat-

and the chaptain of the San Quintin bat-talion officiating.

After the mass and the feast the cor-respondent visited the spot where the fight with Maceo occurred. He was ac-companied by the guide who led the troops on that occasion, and was slown the ex-act spot where the clash between the op-posing sides took place. The conversation of the guide fully confirmed the reports of of the guide fully confirmed the reports of urrence already cabled to the Associated Press

The feast to Major Cirujeda was given under the auspices of the central Callejo, and was a splendid banquet, 1,300 plates being laid. Major Cirujeda, his officers and the men of the column were the honored guests. The Havana grocers' ex-change sent to Cirujoda and to the three wounded officers of his staff splendid watches. The Havana casino and the Civico Militar sent thousands of cigarettes

and eigars as a present to the soldiers.

The fenst passed off in the best order, cheers being given for Spain, the queen regent, the minister of war Captain General Weyler, the Marquis Abumeda, the army and navy and Major Cirujeda. It was voted unanimously by the partici-pants in the feast to petition the town council to change the name of Punta Brava to San Quintin, in honor of Major Cirujeda's battallon. A telegram of felicitation was sent to Major Cirujeda's wife, and before the feast broke up a message was received from the queen regent, through the Marquis Ahumeda, congrat-ulating her gedson, the young Alfonso, Marquis de Grijalba, who came voluntar-ily to serve as corporal under Major Ciru-

It was noticed along the route to Punta Brava that many houses had been de-stroyed within sight of the roadside.

Still Asserting That Macco Lives. TAMPA, Fla., Dec. 21.—Passengers ar-iving on the steamship Olivette last night from Havana report that the people generally there are more tenaciously than ever clinging to the belief that Maceo still lives. The report current there is that Macco accepted the invitation of the Spaniards to consult under a flag of truce. and that instead of going himself he sent one Medina, a Caban very much resem-bling him, and that it was Medina who was assassinated, and that for stragetic reasons Maceo remains quiet. Last Friday a negro woman, 26 years-old, was arrested for being a member of the insurgent band. She was given military trial and sentenced to be shot. This is a new departure in the war.

ASHTABULA, O., Dec. 21.—Details of a fatal fire which occurred at Sheffield, seven miles from here, have been received. Mr. miles from here, have been received. Tried to Wreck a Trolley Car.

WILKESBARRE, Pa., Dec. 21.—An at-tempt was made to wreck the last electric car from Plains. On a heavy grade an fron rall was proceed on the track in such a po-sition that when the car struck it it would he thrown down a steep canbankment. At the intersection of the trolley rails with the rails of the Central railroad canal branch, a huge piece of iron was driven. The motorman noticed the obstruction in time to avert a calamity.

Bituminous Miners' Strike Off. TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Dec. 21.—The bitu-minous miners of the four big companies in Vigo, Park and Vermillion counties have voted to accept fifty-five cents. It is expected that operators elsewhere who conceded sixty cents will ask for a re-duction. This ends the strike, which has been on since May 1.


