

Has Probably Averted War Between Nicaragua and Colombia.

THE CORN ISLAND CONTROVERSY.

Colombia Was Preparing to Take Possession of Territory Claimed by Nicaragua. Of Course Great Britain Had Put in a Claim for the Island.

Manauga, Nicaragua, Jan. 2.—With little beating of drums or blowing of frumpels a warlike move upon the part of the republic of Colombia is now be-lieved to have been checkmated by the re-

public of Nicaragua, although further nows from the objective point. Corn Isl-and, is anxiously expected here. About a month ago the government of Nicaragna was informed unofficially that Colombia had planned to make a landing on Corn Island a valuable strategic soct. on Corn Island, a valuable strategic spot, altuated about thirty-six miles off Mosquito coast, and belonging to Nicaragus, whose flag was to be hailed down and the ensign of Colombia substituted for it. Nicaragna troops were assembled here and at Granada, and when all was ready they were sent in small parties across Lake Nicaragna and down the San Juan river to Greytown and Bluefleids. By this time the soldiers of Nicaragua are believed to be in possession of Big and Little Corn Island, for there are two of them, and the work of erecting a strong fori should be progressing. The troops took with them the best guus available and a supply of ammunition and other supplies. Storehouses and barracks are also to be

onstructed at Corn Island. Of course, if the Colombian expedition started earlier than they expected, and reached Corn Island before the Nicaraguan troops, fighting may have occurred before this, and if so the matter may lend to a general upheaval in Central America, for Colombia was warned, diplomatically and through the press early last month, that her seizure of Corn Island might lead to warlike combination of the republics of Salvador and Honduras, in support of Nicaragua, against her. Colombia was also advised, if she still maintained such rights over Corn Island, to submit then o the arbitration of a disinterested repub ic. To these threats and suggestions, ap-parently, no attention was paid. It is hoped here that the Nicaraguan force reached there in advance of the Colombian

beginning on the maritime canal of Nica ragua, it was reported that Great Britain was contemplating laying hands on Corn Island, which, situated a short distance from the Atlantic entrance of the canal would have been quickly converted into another of the chain of British forts on the American coast, and would have enabled Great Britain practically to command the eastern entrance of the waterway which is in time to join the Atlantic to the Pacific. Thereupon Nicaragua, act ing upon suggestions, possibly from the United States, took official possession of both Big and Little Corn Islands, hoisting the Nicaraguan flag over them with much ceremony and giving diplomatic notice of

The British claim to Corn Island is understood to be lased on her former pre-tensions, since given up, to a protectorate over the Mosquito territory, and because Colombia, which originally owned Corn Island, ceded the Islands to King George. then the governing chieftain, under British auspices, of the Mosquito reservation. Colombia, however, insists that Corn Island was called to King George only collition that it was to be returned ent owner of what was the Mosquito reservation, now a part of the republic of Nicureum, disputes this point, especially as the time for releng it officially has love since passed, and helds that Corn l and was part of the Mosquito territory, and as much is now a portion of Nicaragua

It will thus be seen that the dispute is a pretty one as it stands, and that much may depend upon which country's troops first land on Corn Island and place it in a state of defense. The Nicaraguan government has strong hopes that the blue and white flag of Nicaragua is now floating over Corn Island, otherwise this news would not have been allowed to leak out would not have been allowed to leak out.

Corn Island, up to the present, has been
little more than the headquarters of very
numerous bands of smugglers, and it has
hitherto been found difficult, if not im-

possible, to keep a garrison there. The soldiers, having nothing to do but lastly mount guard now and again, while bask-ing in warm sunshine in a delightful elimate, soon became too friendly with the smugglers and eventually desert in the smuggler's boats to the east coast of Nicaragua and ever after escape from military duty. Now, however, steps are to be taken to prevent this dwindling away of the Nicaraguan garrison.

Terrible Mining Disaster in Mexico, CITY OF MEXICO, Jan. 2.—A terrible dis-aster has occurred in the Santa Gertrust mine, at Pachura, one of the most famous silver mines in the country. Fire broke out in one of the levels of the old south-ern workings Thursday, shutting off the sxit of thirteen Mexican minera. Miners on the outside went to work to try to put out the fire and save the men. One Englishman, Ned Bichards, an experienced miner, went down in charge of the rescue operations, but perished from sufficiation. All the Mexicans died from the same cause or from burning. The bodies have not yet been recovered.

The steamer Dauntless, which left this port Tuesday afternoon, has reached the key where the men and cargo were left. and succeeded in taking them aboard, and they are supposed to be now on the way to Cuba again. A disjutch to The Citizen from Key West gives v., following infor-

The Dauntless arrived at No Name Key Thursday night, and the transportation of the arms and men from the Island to the steamer was begun immediately. Four Key West schooners assisted in the trans-fer of men and arms from the key to the steamer. While the work was to progress two steamers were seen to pass, giving the fillbusters a fright and necessitating the suspension of operations for the time being. Asonre was also caused by several newspaper men visiting the camp in a tug from Key West. So soon as the algust was given that the visitors were friends, however, all fears were allayed, and the work was continued again. Three news-paper men are aboard, the Dauntless, and

Commodore Stuck on a Bar. JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Jan. 2.—The Commodors, which cleared from this port on Thursday night, bound for Cuba, with arms and ammunition, grounded in the St. John's river at Commosfore's Point, a few miles below the city, and remained there all night. The revenue cutter Boutwell wept down the river yesterday and pulled the vessel off. The Commodore crossed the bar about 2 o'clock and headed for Cuba. The Three Friends is now free from the custody of the government. The question whether the Three Friends fired upon a Spanish cruiser will, however, be brought before the grand jury.
