

The present laws, which have come-down from colonial times, have a sangularry aspect, and prescribe death for sixty offenses of various character. The bill passed yesterday reduces these offenses to five-preason, rape, murder and two offenses applicable to she army and navy. In all other offenses hard labor for life is substituted as the maximum punishment, and even in cases of marder and rape hard labor may be substituted if the jury states in its verdlet "without
