MILLIONE OF ACRES INVOLVED.

The Measure Will Open Up for Settlement All Public Lands Arguired from Indians, a Total of 33,959,541 Acres-Oleomargarine Bill Passes the House.

WASHINGTON, JAD. 15 .- The senate yes terday passed the measure known as the free homesteal bill which has been under discussion since the boltday recess. It is e measure of far reaching importance particularly to the west, and the interest in it was shown by the fact that a plank concerning is was a feature of the several antional platforms. The effect of the bill is to open to sattlement all public lands acquired from Indians free of any paymint to the government beyond the minor office fees, and to release from payment those who have heretofore settled on these The number of acres involved, ac cording to an estimation made by the

commissioner of the general land office, is E5,252,541, which would have yielded the government, at the prices heretofors es-tablished, \$35,913,000

To offset this statement it was brought out during the debate that the lands were mainly arid, and that those who had setthat upon them were unable to make pay-ment by reason of the seanty products of the soil. The western senators, in the main, favored the bill as an extension of the general homestead pollcy of the gov-ernment. The opposition was directed nainly by Mr. Platt of Connecticut and Mr. Vilas of Wisconsin. As the bill passed the house it covered only the lands ac-quired from Indians in Oklahoma, but as passed yesterday the bill includes all In-dian lands. The final voto taken by agreement at 4 p. m. showed a decisive major-ity in favor of the measure, it being passed by 85 to 11.

Following the disposition of this bill, which had held the advantageous position of the unfinished business of the senate, Mr. Morgan sought to have the Nicarau-guan canal bill made the unfinished busi-ness. This precipitated a vote, which to some extent was a test of strength of the bill itself. The senate adjourned over to Mon-

The house spont almost the entire day debating the Grout bill, which was under consideration for a time on Wednesday, to subject obcomargarins and other imita-tion dairy products to the laws of the states into which they are transported. The advocates of the measure took the view that the states should be allowed to regulate the sale of a product salling un der false colors and the opponents that the bill would establish a daugerous precedent and invade the power of congress to regu-late interstate commerce.
