# ADRIFT ON AN ICE FLOE.

Perilous Condition of Nine Fishermen on Lake Michigan.

LITTLE HOPE OF THEIR RESCUE

Unless the Tee Drifts Against Chambers Island or Green Island It is Considered Certain That the Mon Are Lost-Great Property Loss,

MENOMIES, Mich., Jan. 16.—Nine mon-are clinging to a block of lee, a few reds square, that is being driven out of Green-bay into Lake Michigan by a flores south-erly gale. The wind is blowing thirty miles an hour, and carries on a zero temperature and an occasional snow squall. The men are flahermen, clad only in the none too heavy clothing worn while tending their nets, and unless the ice flee has blown against Chambers Island or Green Island there is little possibility that they will survive. The doomed men are residents of the little fishing village of Mene-kaunes, and their wives and children and neighbors are on the mountains of lee that fringe the beach, weeping.

Yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock a strip of ice about ten miles long, extending south from the mouth of the Menominee river, broke from the west shore and was carried rapidly toward the cast shore of Green bay, in the direction of Death's

When the floe left its anchorage thisthe lee, tending their nets, but were so far alarm had been given the crack was so wide they could not escape to the shore. Signals of discress were displayed, but it was some time before they were discovered, and meantime the ice had swept well toward the middle of the bay. Two yawis wers manned and four men were brought to the shore, but the others, fearing that help could not reach them from Manistique or Menomines, had rushed to the eastern side of the ice, evidently insunding to at-tempt to escape to Green Island, and thus reach Chambers Island or Dear Binfi, on the east shore of Green bay. As the darkness settled down, however, the lee could be seen carrying well into the lake, and

fishermen think escape is impossible.
