## THE WEEK IN CONGRESS

### Niagara Canal Bill the Feature of Both Branches.

### IMMIGRATION BILL IN THE HOUSE

Senator-elect Kenney May Present His Credentials During the Week—The Bankruptcy Bill Will Probably Have Night of Way in the Senate.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25.—The Senate program this week is regarded very generally by the conditions of the Niagara canal bill. With that measure out of the way, the bankruptcy bill probably will give the night of way early in the week, but even with the road cleared to the extent of the removal of the Niagara bill it is not probable that any headway will be made with the bankruptcy bill before Wednesday, notwithstanding it is the special order for today. Mr. Marshall, of Michigan, who has made an earnest attempt to prevent the bill from going to conference, will lead the opposition to the bill, as agreed on by the conferees. There seems to be little doubt that the friends of the measure will be triumphant in the end, as the sentiment in favor of an immigration bill in the house is, as shown by the vote on previous occasions, in a strong majority. Nevertheless, Mr. Marshall's purpose to do all in his power to defeat the conference report. Two appropriation bills, the agriculture and inland navigation bill, which will probably consume the remainder of the week. There are some features of both bills which may cause considerable debate. Such time as can be spared will be given to the committee to call up such bills as have been reported to them.

Finally, when water had been turned on, the fire was under control, but the damage done to the factory was estimated at \$200,000, and on the building at \$100,000.

## FAMINE IN INDIA

### Reports of Famine and Starvation Much Heightened.

LONDON, Jan. 25.—A representative of the Associated Press who is traveling through the famine districts in India, accompanying the government's party of inspection, sends a dispatch Saturday from Kuchipudi. He says that the reports which have been sent to England and the United States of the acute famine said to exist in the southern Malabar states have been exaggerated, so far as his observation has extended. A scarcity of grain does, indeed, prevail in the extreme eastern portion of this region, but the people there were able to escape want by migrating, most of them, to the fertile Kancon plains and elsewhere, where the sharpness of the grain supply is not felt.

The mahajahs, in an interview with the Associated Press representative on the prospects of his people escaping starvation, said that his class expected a famine of every 30 years, and were therefore not taken unawares or unprepared when it came. They were prepared, he said, to spend five lacs of rupees for relief in his territory.

The British resident was also laboring and confirmed the statements of the mahajahs as to the situation, adding that the relief organization was most efficient in the Bombay section, and that the difficulties from famine had of course been and are now being met by the British government. The resident summed up his views as follows: "My observation has been in traveling over the whole western side that the famine is not so severe there, though it may be more so in some places. It is the districts in which I have traveled I have not heard of a single death from starvation."

## THE INSURGENTS ACT UP

### General Weyler Encamped in Matanzas Province.

### THE CAPTURE OF SANTA CLARA

Confirmed by Travelers Arriving in Mexico—Both Sides Burning Plantations.

CUBANS NEED MONEY. CITY OF MEXICO, Jan. 25.—Various travelers arriving from Cuba confirm the capture of Santa Clara by the Cubans and also bring news that the insurgents have been fighting in the neighborhood of Havana, and a few days ago, wrecked a passenger train within twenty miles of that city. Two young Englishmen, direct from Cuba—Harry E. York and Lee A. Harvey—have reached this city after having passed several weeks in Cuba and with the insurgent army part of the time and the remainder in the field with the Spanish troops. Harvey has received a shot through the left arm. They are preparing a report for Senator Cameron, which will be forwarded to Washington in a few days. The Cubans are not in want of men, but money, ammunition and medicine. There are not over 30,000 Cubans, while the Spaniards and volunteers now number 250,000 men, mostly very young and not good fighting material.

All operations are in the nature of guerrilla warfare, and both sides are systematically burning plantations, and the country will be reduced to barbarism. The Cubans are expected to be favored by McKinley, and expect immediately to see the United States recognize their belligerency, if not their independence. Harvey gives a graphic account of the capture of Santa Clara by the insurgents, where the utmost gallantry was displayed and the Spaniards being overcome by the magnificent valor of the patriots. Harvey says it was told him in the Cuban camp that Manco had his lower jaw shot away, but was alive and recuperating.

General Gomez is not treating for peace, and although there is a peace party among the Cubans it is small one. The capture of the town of Aguanay by the Cubans was a brilliant piece of work. Three thousand Spaniards held the place, but the Cubans showed better generalship.

At Santa Clara the Cubans took and held the town just long enough to ruin it. Harvey does not consider there is any decided prospect of victory for either side.

General Rouseff to be Tried in Baltimore. BALTIMORE, Jan. 25.—It is expected that General Carlos Rouseff, secretary of war of the Cuban provisional government, and Dr. Jose J. Luis, a complotist, will be brought to Baltimore to be tried in the United States district court upon the charge of being accessories to the Wood-Allen expedition upon the Wood-Allen in July, 1895. The determination to remove the case to Baltimore for trial was made at the suggestion of Attorney General Harman, who was of the opinion that as the Wood-Allen had been purchased here, had been fitted out here and started from here, the trial should occur here instead of New York, where the expedition was planned. Commissioner Shields adjourned the hearing until next Saturday in order that United States District Attorney Marbury might bring the matter to the attention of Judge Morris and the United States grand jury this week.

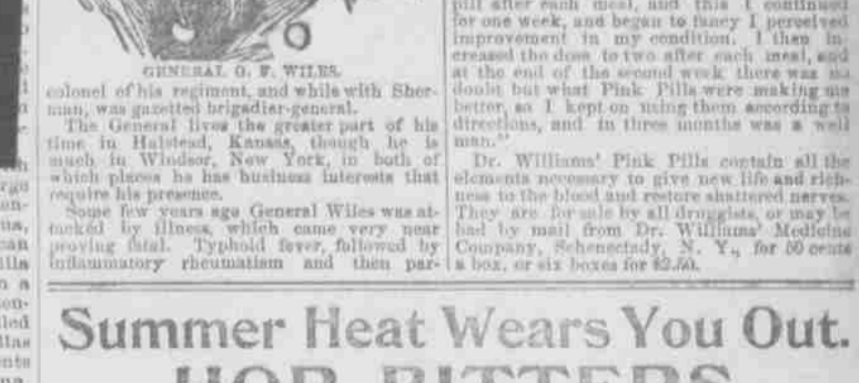
